SUBJECT: Agreement with the City of Daly City, Bayshore School District, Brisbane Elementary School District, Jefferson Elementary School District, and South San Francisco Unified School District.

RECOMMENDATION

Adopt a resolution authorizing the President of the Board to execute an agreement with the City of Daly City, Bayshore School District, Brisbane School District, Jefferson Elementary School District, and South San Francisco Unified School District to support the expansion of the Daly City Peninsula Partnership Collaborative for the two-year period of July 1, 2000 through June 30, 2002.

BACKGROUND

The Daly City Peninsula Partnership Collaborative was formed in 1995 with the mission to promote and facilitate collaborative efforts to ensure that young children and their families have access to the health, education, and social services they need to be successful in school and in life. Services focus on families and young children from before birth to third grade. After school and kindergarten readiness services were initially implemented at two school sites.

DISCUSSION

During the next two fiscal years, the Collaborative plans to expand services by adding six program sites and will be serving all sixteen Daly City public elementary schools by the end of the period. Program components include kindergarten readiness, tutoring, homework assistance, enrichment classes, and neighborhood involvement through volunteers in partnership program. A full-time program supervisor and four full-time program coordinators will provide direct oversight of the program activities. HSA experienced delay in writing this contract because City of Daly City was negotiating with South San Francisco unified School District as one of the new Daly City Peninsula Partnership Collaborative and their Board signed the contract on January 11, 2001.

OUTCOMES:

The Collaborative will provide tutoring services, homework assistance, enrichment classes and kindergarten readiness classes so that children will be successful in school and in life and it is intended that the community will assist in this partnership with the collaborative. The program has the following objectives that will enable children to:

- Experience school success by the third grade by receiving tutoring services.
- Develop positive work habits to enable children to attain higher school success.
- Expand their scope of learning by taking enrichment classes.
- Develop appropriate classroom behavior and gain a higher level of comfort in the classroom.

THIS AGREEMENT, entered into this ______ day of _____, 20___, by and between the COUNTY OF SAN MATEO, hereinafter called County, and the CITY OF DALY CITY hereinafter called "City", BAYSHORE SCHOOL DISTRICT, BRISBANE ELEMENTARY SCHOOL DISTRICT, AND JEFFERSON ELEMENTARY SCHOOL DISTRICT, SOUTH SAN FRANCISCO UNIFIED SCHOOL DISTRICT; all of which entities are referred to collectively as "the Parties"

WITNESSETH

WHEREAS, the Daly City Peninsula Partnership Collaborative was formed in 1995 with the mission to promote and facilitate collaborative efforts to ensure those young children and their families have access to the health education and social services they need to be successful in school and in life, and

WHEREAS, the initial focus of the collaborative efforts is on families and young children before birth to third grade, and

WHEREAS, it is necessary and desirable that the parties enter into an agreement to establish a collaborative effort to support and expand the Daly City Peninsula Partnership Collaborative, and

WHEREAS, the Parties have each designated funds and/or services to support the Daly City Peninsula Partnership Collaborative, and

WHEREAS, the Parties desire to enter into an agreement to provide support to the Daly City Peninsula Partnership Collaborative

2 **Definitions**

The Parties are entering into this Agreement for the sole purpose of providing assistance to and supporting the expansion of the Daly City Peninsula Partnership Collaborative The expansion services supported under this Agreement are described in Exhibit A, attached hereto and incorporated by reference herein

3 Oversight of the Daly City Peninsula Partnership Collaborative expansion services

Oversight of Daly City Peninsula Partnership Collaborative 1s provided by a Board of Directors, which is composed, or representatives of each of the collaborative partners

4 Payments

For the 2000/2001 fiscal year each of the parties shall contribute to the funding of the Daly City Peninsula Partnership Collaborative expansion services County shall contribute the sum of ONE HUNDRED FIFTY THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$150,000), the City of Daly City shall contribute the sum of FORTY EIGHT THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND SIXTY EIGHT DOLLARS (\$48,868), Bayshore School District shall contribute the sum of FIVE THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$5,000) or equivalent services, Brisbane Elementary School District shall contribute the sum of FIVE THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$5,000) or equivalent services, Jefferson Elementary School District shall contribute the sum of FIFTY ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED DOLLARS (\$51,800) or equivalent services; and South San Francisco Unified School District shall contribute the sum of FIVE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED DOLLARS (\$5,900) or equivalent services

For the 2001/2002 fiscal year each of the parties shall contribute to the funding of the Daly City Peninsula Partnership Collaborative expansion services County shall contribute the sum of TWO HUNDRED THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$200,000), the City of Daly City shall contribute the sum of SIXTY NINE THOUSAND SIX HUNDRED FOURTEEN DOLLARS (\$69,614), Bayshore School District shall contribute the sum of FIVE THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$5,000) or equivalent services, Brisbane Elementary School District shall contribute the sum of FIVE THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$5,000) or equivalent services, Jefferson Elementary School District shall contribute the sum of SIXTY THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$60,000) or equivalent services; and South San Francisco Unified School District shall contribute the sum of TEN THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$10,000) or equivalent services The funds for both fiscal years shall be utilized according to the 2000-2001 Daly City Peninsula Partnership Collaborative Expansion Project budget which is included in Exhibit B of this agreement

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5 **Relationship of Parties**

a A full-time Program Supervisor will continue to be employed by the City of Daly City for the 2000-2001 and 2001-2002 fiscal years The Program Supervisor will report to the City Manager of Daly City or his designee and the Executive Committee of the Board of Directors of the Daly City Peninsula Partnership Collaborative The Executive Committee is comprised of one representative each from the County, City, and a participating school district The Program Supervisor will oversee the overall program and provide the administrative support and direction for the program

b Periodic meetings will take place between the Parties to assure that services are being delivered adequately and to resolve any problems that may arise in the collaborative process

.6 Hold Harmless

a Each party hereto ("indemnitor") hereby agrees to defend, indemnify, and save harmless the other parties and their respective governing boards, councils, officers, boards, commissions, agents, and employees (collectively, "Indemnitees") against and from any all claims, suits, actions of every name, kind, and description, which may be brought against indemnitees, or any of them, by reason of any injury to, or death of, any person (including corporations, partnerships, and associations) or damage suffered or sustained by any such person solely arising from any act or omission to act, negligent or otherwise, of indemnitees, their officers, agents, or employees under this Agreement

b. In the event of concurrent negligence of any of the Parties, its officers and/or employees, then the liability for any and all claims for injuries or damages to persons and/or property which arise out of terms and conditions of this Agreement shall be apportioned according to the California theory of comparative negligence

7 <u>Insurance</u>

A. The Parties shall not commence work or be required to commence work under this Agreement unless and until all insurance required under this paragraph has been obtained and such insurance has been approved by the Director of Human Services and Parties shall use due diligence to obtain such issuance and to obtain such approval The Parties shall furnish the Human Services Agency with certificates of insurance evidencing the required coverage, and there shall be a specific contractual liability endorsement extending the Parties coverage to include the contractual liability assumed by the Parties pursuant to this Agreement These certificates shall specify or be endorsed to provide that thirty (30) days' notice must be given, in writing, to the Human Services Agency of any pending change in the limits of liability or of any cancellation or modification of the policy.

(1) <u>Worker's Compensation and Employer's Liability Insurance</u>

The Parties shall have in effect during the entire life of this Agreement Worker's Compensation and Employer's Liability Insurance providing full statutory coverage. In signing this Agreement, the Parties makes the following certification, required by Section 1861 of the California Labor Code⁻

I am aware of the provisions of Section 3700 of the California Labor Code which requires every employer to be insured against liability for Worker's Compensation or to undertake self-insurance in accordance with the provisions of the Code, and I will comply with such provisions before commencing the performance of the work of this Agreement

(2) <u>Liability Insurance</u> The Parties shall take out and maintain during the life of this Agreement such Bodily Injury Liability and Property Damage Liability Insurance as shall protect them while performing work covered by this Agreement from any and all claims for damages for bodily injury, including accidental death, as well as any and all claims for property damage which may arise from Parties operations under this Agreement, whether such operations be by themselves or by any sub-contractor or by anyone directly or indirectly employed by either of them Such insurance shall be combined single limit bodily injury and property damage for each occurrence and shall be not less than the amount specified below A program of self-insurance in lieu of insurance and proof of such a program is also acceptable in fulfilling the requirements of this paragraph

Such insurance shall include

(a)	Comprehensive General Liability	\$ 1,000,000
(b)	Motor Vehicle Liability Insurance	\$ 1,000,000
(c)	Professional Liability	\$ -0-

After one (1) year from the date this Agreement is first executed, the County may, at its sole discretion, require an increase in the amount of liability insurance to the level then customary in similar County agreements by giving sixty (60) days notice to Parties County and its officers, agents, employees and servants shall be named as additional insured on any such policies of insurance, which shall also contain a provision that the insurance afforded thereby to the County, its officers, agents, employees and servants shall be primary insurance to the full limits of liability of the policy, and that if the County or its officers and employees have other insurance against the loss covered by such a policy, such other insurance shall be excess insurance only

In the event of the breach of any provision of this section, or in the event any notice is received which indicates any required insurance coverage will be diminished or canceled, the County of San Mateo at its option, may, notwithstanding any other provision of this Agreement to the contrary, immediately declare a material breach of this Agreement and suspend all further work pursuant to this Agreement

8 Non-Discrimination

Parties shall comply with the non-discrimination requirements described below

A Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973

1) Pursuant to Section 504 (Public Law 93-112), the Parties agree that no otherwise qualified disabled individual shall, solely by reason of a disability, be excluded from the participation in, be denied the benefits of, or be subjected to discrimination in the performance of this contract

- 2) Compliance of Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973, as amended, requires that all benefits, aids and services are made available to disabled persons on an equivalent basis with those received by nondisabled persons Parties shall agree to be in compliance with Section 504 requirements by 1) signing the Letter of Assurance, attached and incorporated herein as Exhibit C, or 2) by developing a plan for compliance to be submitted to the Section 504 Coordinator, Department of Health Services, as soon as possible but not later than by the end of the current Fiscal Year
- B <u>Non-Discrimination General</u> No person shall, on the grounds of age (over 40), ancestry, creed, color, disability, marital status, medical conditions, national origin, political or religious affiliation, race, sex, sexual orientation or any nonjob-related criteria be excluded from participation in, be denied the benefits, or be subjected to discrimination under this Agreement
- C <u>Non-Discrimination Employment</u> Parties shall ensure equal employment opportunity based on objective standards of recruitment, selection, promotion, classification, compensation, performance evaluations, and management relations, for all employees under this Agreement Parties equal employment opportunity policies shall be made available to County upon request

9 Child Abuse Prevention and Reporting

Parties agree to ensure that all known or suspected instances of child abuse or neglect are reported to a child protective agency as defined in Penal Code Section 11165 9 This responsibility shall include

A A requirement that all employees, consultants, or agents performing services under this contract who are required by Penal Code Section 11166(a), to report child abuse or neglect, sign a statement that he or she knows of the reporting requirement and will comply with it

B Establishing procedures to ensure reporting even when employees, consultants, or agents who are not required to report child abuse under Penal Code 11166(a), gain knowledge of, or reasonably suspect that a child has been a victim of abuse or neglect

C At County's sole discretion, Parties agree that its employees and/or its subcontractors, assignees, and volunteers who, during the course of performing services under this agreement, have contact with children will be fingerprinted in order to determine whether they have a criminal history which would compromise the safety of children with whom contractor's employees and/or its subcontractors, assignees, or volunteers have contact

10. <u>Records</u>

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a The Parties agree to keep adequate records to satisfy the respective requirements of each of the Parties Human Services Agency staff will participate in the program evaluation b The right of privacy shall be guaranteed to the students and their families in accordance with the Family Rights and Privacy act, State or Federal law, federal grant guidelines and the parties respective procedures regarding confidentiality

11 Alteration of Agreement

This Agreement is entire and contains all the terms and conditions agreed upon by the parties No alteration or variation shall be valid unless made in writing and signed by the parties hereto, and no oral understanding or agreement shall be binding on the parties hereto

12 Interpretation and Enforcement

A Any notice, request, demand or other communication required or permitted hereunder shall be deemed to be properly given when deposited in the United States mail, postage prepaid, or when deposited with a public telegraph company for transmittal, charges prepaid, addressed

This Agreement may be terminated by Parties, Director of Human Services or her designee at any time upon thirty (30) days written notice to the other party In the event that the agreement is terminated, the County shall not be liable for any further payments

The Daly City Peninsula Partnership Collaborative was formed in 1995 with the mission to promote and facilitate collaborative efforts to ensure that young children and their families have access to the health, education and social services they need to be successful in school and in life The initial focus of the collaborative efforts is on families and young children from before birth to third grade Important milestones in the mission are learning readiness by kindergarten and literacy by third grade The Daly City Peninsula Partnership Collaborative Expansion Services described herein will expand school-based services supported by the Collaborative

- A The City of Daly City will continue to employ a full-time Program Supervisor This position will report to the City Manager or his designee and the Executive Committee of the Board of Directors of the Daly City Peninsula Partnership Collaborative The Program Supervisor will
 - 1. Oversee the overall program and provide the administrative support and direction for the program
 - 2. Work with the Board of Directors to investigate ongoing funding sources for the program for both sustainability and to serve the entire community
 - 3 Meet with school principals to recruit individuals to staff each of the program components at each of the thirteen sites in fiscal year 2000-2001 and sixteen sites in fiscal year 2001-2002
 - 4 Distribute supplies as needed to the various program components
 - 5. Recruit, train and supervise two full-time Program Coordinators and two parttime (50 FTE) Program Coordinators in fiscal year 2000-2001 and four fulltime Program Coordinators in fiscal year 2001-2002

- B The four Peninsula Partnership Program Coordinators will be the City of Daly City employees Each Program Coordinator will be responsible for between one and six sites The Program Coordinator's responsibilities include the following
 - 1 Plan, coordinate, direct and evaluate the specific activities of the Daly City Peninsula Partnership Collaborative at the assigned school sites for prekindergarten through third grade Activities include kindergarten readiness, tutoring, and homework assistance and enrichment classes
 - 2 Recruit, train, supervise and evaluate part-time, contractual and volunteer staff
 - 3 Prepare and monitor specific site budgets Prepare reports and correspondence Assist in the preparation and writing of grants and proposals as needed
 - 4 Attend and assist in conducting training conferences and workshops
 - 5 Maintain accurate inventory of supplies and equipment
 - 6 Work with a variety of non profit agencies, middle and high school students, and other volunteer and mentoring groups within the community to create a pool of volunteers who will be available for their assigned program sites
 - 7 Collect and input data from individual school sites per the program outcomes
- C In fiscal year 2000-2001 establish thirteen complete program sites at Bayshore, Christopher Columbus, Colma, Daniel Webster, F D Roosevelt, Garden Village, George Washington, John F Kennedy, Junipero Serra, M P Brown, M H Tobias, Panorama, and Woodrow Wilson Elementary Schools Provide the following service components at each of the thirteen sites
 - 1 Tutoring

In fiscal year 2000-2001, 180 children will receive after school tutoring In fiscal year 2001-2002, 200 children will receive after school tutoring

2 Homework Assistance.

In fiscal year 2000-2001, 240 children will receive after school homework assistance In fiscal year 2001-2002, 270 children will receive after school homework

In fiscal year 2001-2002, 270 children will receive after school homework assistance

3 Enrichment Classes

In fiscal year 2000-2001, 2,100 children will participate in after school enrichment classes In fiscal year 2001-2002, 2,400 children will participate in after school enrichment classes

4 Kindergarten Readiness⁻

In fiscal year 2000-2001, 300 four year olds will participate in kindergarten readiness classes In fiscal year 2001-2002, 360 four year olds will participate in kindergarten readiness classes

- D Intended Program Outcomes
 - 1 Tutoring Program The intended outcome is to achieve literacy in the third grade, demonstrated by 5% increase in third grade reading scores over the 3 year period in schools where site collaborative target their experience of school success by the third grade This will be measured by parent surveys and norm referenced pre and post testing conducted in the fall and spring of the school year
 - 2 Homework Assistance Program The intended outcome is to establish early positive work habits to enable a higher chance of school success This will be measured by surveying the students, their parents, and teachers as to motivation to complete homework and comprehension of homework concepts in the classroom
 - 3 Enrichment Classes The intended outcome is to involve the students in positive life-long enriching activities, and to enlarge the scope of children's learning by offering a variety of experiences for them to explore This will be measured by surveying students, their parents, and teachers as to how they envision using their new interest areas and what the carryover effect has been in the classroom
 - 4 Kindergarten Readiness The intended outcome is for children who have not been exposed to preschool programs to develop appropriate classroom behavior and a higher level of comfort in the classroom Pre and post lollipop testing will be used by all sites to measure this
