

THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS, COUNTY OF SAN MATEO, STATE OF CALIFORNIA PROCLAMATION DESIGNATING MARCH 30, 2001 AS

CESAR CHAVEZ DAY

PROCLAIMED, by the Board of Supervisors of the County of San Mateo, State of California, in support of the Cañada College/Redwood City School District Kinder Caminata, that this event on March 30, 2001 a Day to Honor the Life and Legacy of Cesar Chavez by Raising Our Expectations and Reaffirming Our Commitment to the Personal, Academic, and Career Success of Every Child in San Mateo County.

WHEREAS, Cañada College and the Redwood City School District have entered into an agreement with one another and with KinderCaminata Inc., a non-profit, public benefit organization, to establish the KinderCaminata program in San Mateo County, and

WHEREAS, KinderCaminata has reinforced the critical importance of early literacy, study of the Latino cultural heritage, and the diligent pursuit of K-12 learning, and has raised expectations for college and career success for children in California's multicultural communities, and

WHEREAS, on California's first official Cesar Chavez Day, on March 30, 2001, family members and caring adults from schools, community colleges, businesses, government agencies, arts groups, service clubs, and other diverse organizations from our great community will volunteer to introduce more than 500 Redwood City kindergartners to an array of future career possibilities and a performance that pays tribute to the beauty of Latino cultural heritage at the first KinderCaminata to be held at Cañada College; and

WHEREAS, Kinder Caminata will effectively show that education can offer a wide and welcoming pathway to whatever each child may dream, and that college begins in Kindergarten,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT PROCLAIMED that this Board of Supervisors does hereby support the Cañada/Redwood City School District KinderCaminata and proclaims March 30, 2001 as a day to honor the life and legacy of Cesar Chavez by raising our expectations and reaffirming our commitment to the personal academic, and career success of every child in San Mateo County Sí, Se Puede!
