Reconstruction of Beresford Avenue and Sequoia Avenue - Sequoia Tract, Redwood City Area (Project No. R6J01, F-149 [5Ub])

RECOMMENDATION

Adopt a resolution adopting Plans and Specifications, determining prevailing wage scales, and calling for sealed proposals for the reconstruction of Beresford Avenue and Sequoia Avenue between West Selby Lane and Stockbridge Avenue, and the resurfacing of a portion of Beresford Avenue. (See attached location map).

Previous Board Action

Authorized the Director of Public Works to proceed with the design for the reconstruction of Beresford Avenue from West Selby Lane to Stockbridge Avenue and Sequoia Avenue from West Selby Lane to Stockbridge Avenue using the 22-foot road with 3-foot valley gutter standard.

Discussion

The proposed project consists of the reconstruction of Beresford Avenue and Sequoia Avenue between West Selby Lane and Stockbridge Avenue, and the resurfacing of a portion of Beresford Avenue.

This project qualifies for a Categorical Exemption pursuant to Section 15301.C, Class1, of the Public Resources Code (California Environmental Quality Act [CEQA]), and a Notice of Exemption has been filed with the County Clerk Recorder as provided by County guidelines.

Fiscal Impact

The estimated cost of construction is \$420,000, which is proposed to be financed with Road Funds, Road Mitigation Fees, and AB2928 Transportation Funds There is no impact to the General Fund.

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

RESOLVED, by the Board of Supervisors of the County of San Mateo, State of California, that

WHEREAS, Plans and Specifications have been prepared and approved by the Director of Public Works for the reconstruction of Beresford Avenue and Sequoia Avenue between West Selby Lane and Stockbridge Avenue, and said Plans and Specifications have been filed in the office of the Director of Public Works; and

WHEREAS, a schedule of prevailing wage scales for each craft or type of workman needed to execute this contract in the locality in which said work is to be performed has been established by the Department of Industrial Relations and has been referred to in said Specifications

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY DETERMINED AND ORDERED as follows

- 1. The Plans and Specifications dated June 1, 2001 for the aforesaid project, are on file in the office of the Director of Public Works, to which reference is hereby made for further particulars, are hereby approved and are adopted as the Plans and Specifications to be adhered to in letting and performing the work under a contract for said improvements
- 2. The schedule of prevailing wages referred to in said Specifications has been determined to contain the general prevailing rates of wages in the locality in which said work is to be performed for each craft or type of workman needed to execute said contract
- 3. The Department of Public Works is authorized and directed to issue a call for sealed proposals to be received by the County Manager / Clerk of the Board of Supervisors of San Mateo County, on or before 2:00 p.m., Tuesday, June 26, 2001, in the County Manager / Clerk of the Board of Supervisors' offices in the Hall of Justice and Records, 400 County Center, Redwood City, California. Said bids will then be publicly opened and declared in the County Manager / Clerk of the Board of Supervisors' offices

The Department of Public Works is further directed to cause the Notice inviting sealed proposals to be published for <u>two (2)</u> times in the <u>San Mateo County Times</u>, a newspaper printed and published in this County, and to obtain an affidavit of said publication, a copy of which shall be placed on file with the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors
