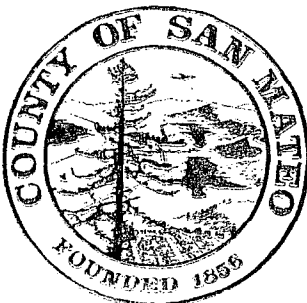

WHEREAS, educational outreach through the Community College Collaborative promotes the recruitment and retention of Human Services workers for all agencies throughout San Mateo County; and

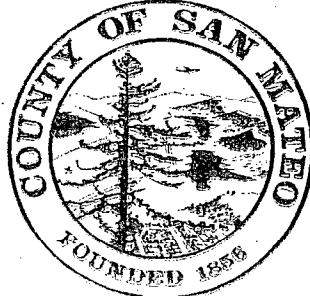
