The following is a proposal to complete some additional commissioning services for the Diagnostic and Test Addition.

SCOPE OF WORK

The project components include the following:

Testing

- Test the revised control sequences for the 5 existing air handlers, to be retrofitted with new variable speed drives.
- Take sample air flow readings from the terminal units to determine if the new higher static pressures have impacted the air delivery from the boxes. All boxes were tested at the time of the original installation, with a balancing report submitted to OSHPD. We will sample test to determine if these flows have been altered with the revised fan configurations. For this work, we will take readings only. Rebalance, if needed, will be addressed as a separate issue.
- Take chilled water flow measurements at each of the air handlers to identify the actual flows of chilled water after correction of the chilled water piping revisions for this wing. Rebalance as necessary.
- Prepare reports and project communications as necessary relative to the test work.

Corrective Actions

• Analyze the results of all the above, and prepare a corrective items list. For all repair and maintenance work, the hospital will implement repairs from this list. If construction is required, that will be a separate list that may or may not require design/bid documents.

- Remain available and involved to consult on any revisions. This includes expediting work packages as necessary.
- Retest, if needed for one additional test. More than one additional test will be handled separately.

FEE PROPOSAL

We propose to work on the above projects on a time-and-expense basis, not to exceed \$17,250. This is inclusive of all expected costs, and incorporates all additional functional testing work done to date under the original contract, plus amendments.

SCHEDULE

Our work will commence as soon as the variable speed drives are installed and functioning.
