WHEREAS, Gene Tate has been the primary person instrumental in getting the Junior Giants Program in East Palo Alto and through that the Giants Community Fund and the Good Tidings Foundation, and

WHEREAS, Gene Tate, through the connections with the Giants Community Fund and the Good Tidings Foundation, the Jack Farrell Park baseball field has been refurbished, and

WHEREAS, Gene Tate has been regarded by his peers as an excellent parent, mentor, historian, and community organizer, and

WHEREAS, the County would like to show its appreciation for Gene Tate's unrelenting passion for teaching, coaching, inspiring, and mentoring children through sports.
