THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS, COUNTY OF SAN MATEO, STATE OF CALIFORNIA PROCLAMATION DESIGNATING THE WEEK OF SEPTEMBER 16-22, 2002 AS

NATIONAL POLLUTION PREVENTION WEEK

PROCLAIMED, by the Board of Supervisors of the County of San Mateo, State of California, that

WHEREAS the Board of Supervisors of San Mateo County support a clean, comfortable, and safe environment for residents and visitors; and

WHEREAS, preventing pollution is a proactive and innovative approach to environmental protection, one that focuses primarily on preventative measures, and is therefore the preferred strategy of environmental protection; and

WHEREAS the prevention of pollution can help to increase industrial efficiency and would therefore save businesses' money and time; and

WHEREAS, pollution prevention offers both the requisite environmental prevention and the resultant increased economic competitiveness; and

WHEREAS, the majority of pollution is caused by indirect sources, and the residents of San Mateo County should raise their awareness to come to the realization that their actions have a direct and immediate impact upon this community; and

WHEREAS, a focus on pollution prevention in the County of San Mateo will help meet the challenges of economic competitiveness, and environmental protection and regulation in the new century;

WHEREAS, NATIONAL POLLUTION PREVENTION WEEK provides an opportunity for industry, citizens, and government to acknowledge the benefits of preventing pollution and adds to the ability of a community to engage a dialogue to lay the foundation for prosperity and sustainability in the future,

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT PROCLAIMED, by declaration of the Board of Supervisors of San Mateo County, that the week of September 16-22, 2002 will be known as "NATIONAL POLLUTION PREVENTION WEEK."
