CENTENNIAL YEAR

PROCLAIMED, by the Board of Supervisors of the County of San Mateo, State of California, that

WHEREAS, San Mateo High School opened its doors on September 15, 1902 with a student body of fourteen and a faculty of three becoming the second public school on the Peninsula; and for one-hundred years San Mateo High School has provided an exemplary public education and served as a community beacon for the families of San Mateo County; and

WHEREAS, San Mateo High School has for one-hundred years taken pride in opening its arms to diversity, and thus has opened the minds of the innumerable students who have donned the mortarboard and gown and for whom it remains their nurturing alma mater; and

WHEREAS, San Mateo High School has engaged in supporting a wholly student run Newsletter San Mateo Hi, which for the past 88 years has been produced by students alone, and has promoted the free exchange of ideas on campus and beyond; and

WHEREAS, San Mateo High School finds its school community inundated with alumni, parent, student, faculty, and community support in this, its proudest hour; and

WHEREAS, the County of San Mateo places the greatest emphasis on the quality of life afforded to the youngest generation, and as the County of San Mateo has found an ally in San Mateo High School, an institution that has repeatedly signified its dedication and determination towards improving the community one student at a time,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT PROCLAIMED that the San Mateo County Board of Supervisors designates the 6th of October, 2002 San Mateo High School Day recognizing the commitment and quality of education administered by San Mateo High School, and commending the achievement of one-hundred meritorious years with hopes for continued and greater success in the years to come.
