## RESOLUTION APPROVING FY 2002-03 STATE LAW ENFORCEMENT SUPPLEMENTAL FUND SPENDING PLANS FOR THE SHERIFF'S OFFICE AND DISTRICT ATTORNEY'S OFFICE, AS REQUIRED UNDER SB736

RESOLVED, by the Board of Supervisors of the County of San Mateo, State of California, that

WHEREAS, Senate Bill 736, chaptered in November, 2001, modified Government Code §30061 to require submission and Board approval of spending plans for all components of State Law Enforcement Supplemental Fund (SLESF) funding; and

WHEREAS, in order to allocate the SLEFS funding, this Board must approve annual spending plans for the District Attorney's allocation for criminal prosecution and the Sheriff's allocation for jail operations and for front-line law enforcement services, which spending plans this Board wishes to approve, and

WHEREAS, the District Attorney's FY 2002-03 criminal prosecution spending plan utilizes \$247,783 in SLESF funds to finance the cost of one Deputy District Attorney and the partial cost of one District Attorney Inspector, and related support costs; and

WHEREAS, the Sheriff's FY 2002-03 jail operations spending plan utilizes \$247,783 in SLESF funds to finance the cost of two Deputies and certain operating expenses within the Sheriff's jail facilities, and the FY 2002-03 front-line law enforcement spending plan utilizes \$135,494 to finance the cost of one detective and partial costs for one support staff person for the Sexual Habitual Offender Program (SHOP); and

WHEREAS, the above-referenced spending plans and SLESF funds are incorporated within the County's Recommended FY 2002-03 budget;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED THAT: the FY 2002-03 SLESF Spending Plans for the Sheriff and District Attorney, pursuant to Government Code Sections 30061 (b) (1), (2), and (3), are hereby approved by this Board of Supervisors, and said approval shall be communicated to the Controllers Office.
