SUBJECT:	Dedication of Sewer Easement Over Property : North View Way, Emerald Lake Hills (COP 2679)

Recommendation

Accept an Easement Grant Deed from David Doidge, Maureen Doidge, Paul Hanley, Nadine Hanley, Persi Diaconis and Susan Holmes for a sewer easement over portions of their properties located on Mountain View Way in the unincorporated Emerald Lake Hills area of the County.

Background

Earlier this year, Paul Hanley, on behalf of the owners along Mountain View Way, contacted the Emerald Lake Heights Sewer Maintenance District to request an extension of the existing District sewer main line. At that time, the line ended on Hanley Trail, and the request was to extend the sewer line up Mountain View Way. The reason for their request is that, as a condition of his building permit for a new house at 572 Mountain View Way, Mr. Hanley is required to repave Mountain View Way. Prior to paving the street, Mr. Hanley along with the other owners on Mountain View Way want to install a sewer line.

The District approved the request and fees were paid by the owners, who installed the new line. The District is now ready to accept the facilities. As a condition to the extension of the sewer line, the owners are required to dedicate an easement to the County for the installation, maintenance and repair of public utilities.

Discussion

The easement deed is presented for the Board's acceptance. All costs for the sewer line are the responsibility of the owners granting the easement.

The Director of Public Works concurs in this recommendation.
