
WHEREAS, PAUL SCANNELL has overseen the sale of more than \$800 million in public financing and refinancing for various County projects and services,





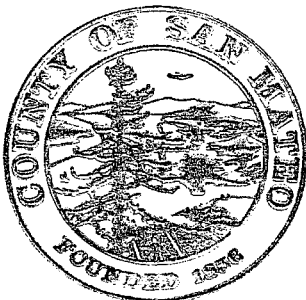
