#### SECOND AMENDMENT TO THE AGREEMENT WITH PENINSULA COMMUNITY FOUNDATION

# THIS SECOND AMENDMENT TO THE AGREEMENT, entered into on this day \_\_\_\_\_\_2004, by and between the COUNTY OF SAN MATEO, hereinafter-called "County", and the PENINSULA COMMUNITY FOUNDATION hereinafter called "Contractor"

#### WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, pursuant to Government Code, Section 31000, County may contract with independent contractors for the furnishing of such services to or for County or any Department/Agency thereof; and

WHEREAS, it is necessary and desirable that Contractor be retained for the purpose of performing the professional services for Human Services Agency, Children and Family Services, hereinafter described, as Promoting Safe and Stable Families in accordance with:

- 1. Federal Omnibus Reconciliation Act of 1993.
- 2. California Department of Social Services Promoting Safe and Stable Families Program.

WHEREAS, the parties have agreed and;

WHEREAS, the Agreement has been amended and;

WHEREAS, the parties wish to further amend the Agreement to add \$412,583 for FY 2003-2004 and \$137,528 for July 1, 2004 through September 30, 2004, for a total obligation of \$1,948,942.

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY AGREED BY THE PARTIES AS FOLLOWS:

#### 1. Section 4 – Paragraph A – Payments, is amended to read as follows:

A. <u>Maximum Amount</u>. In full consideration of Contractor's performance of the services described in Exhibit A-1, the amount that the County shall be obligated to pay for services rendered under this Agreement shall not exceed ONE MILLION, NINE HUNDRED FORTY EIGHT THOUSAND, NINE HUNDRED FORTY TWO DOLLARS (\$1,948,942) for the period October 1, 2001 through September 30, 2004.

### 2. Exhibit A-1 – Program Description for the term OCTOBER 1, 2001 through SEPTEMBER 30, 2004 is amended to read as follows:

The Peninsula Community Foundation (PCF) will serve as the fiscal sponsor for the Peninsula Partnership for Children, Youth and Families (PPCYF) and in that capacity, will accept the legal responsibility for this Agreement, sign all Agreements and discharge the financial obligations on behalf of PPCYF, a coalition of public and private agencies and individuals. In accordance with the three-year plan previously approved by the San Mateo County Board of Supervisors, PCF will distribute San Mateo County Promoting Safe and Stable Families (PSSF) Program funds to fiscal sponsors in nine local collaborative sites that will act as sub-contractors. The collaborative sites, which have been selected because they are home to a large number of children and families in need, are in Daly City, East Palo Alto, Half Moon Bay, Menlo Park, Pacifica, Pescadero, Redwood City, San Mateo and South San Francisco. Permission to sub-contract is attached as **Exhibit A-2**.

PCF will direct PPCYF to support and oversee the implementation of the PSSF program in the collaborative sites and will abide by the regulations set forth by the California Department of Social Services (CDSS) for this program. An outline of PPCYF's plan for program monitoring is attached as **EXHIBIT D**.

The collaborative sites will implement the PSSF program as part of a broader sustainability plan to develop a comprehensive, integrated and community-based system of services and informal supports to help families meet the health, education, emotional, social and economic needs of their young children. Systems in each of the nine collaborative sites will focus on families and children from before birth through third grade and will seek to accomplish the outcomes of school readiness by kindergarten and academic success by third grade. In accordance with CDSS requirements, at least 40% of the total PSSF funds will be used by the nine collaborative sites for Adoption Promotion and Support, and Time-Limited Family Reunification in Year Three (3) FY 2003-2004.

### 3. Exhibit A-2 – Approval to Sub-Contract for the term OCTOBER 1, 2001 through SEPTEMBER 30, 2004 is amended to read as follows:

As specified in Paragraph 10B, written permission is given to the Peninsula Community Foundation to employ specific consultants and sub-contractors to carry out responsibilities pursuant to this Agreement. In doing so, the Peninsula Community Foundation will use approved forms and monitor the expenditure of the funds and the execution of the service. The Peninsula Community Foundation will further see that the consultants and subcontractors adhere to all the terms and conditions required by the San Mateo County Human Services Agency as part of this Agreement including, but not limited to, insurance requirements and audit procedures.

Approval is given for the Peninsula Community Foundation to enter into Agreements with the following sub-contractors to carry out the responsibilities of this Agreement:

- Cabrillo Unified School District for the Cabrillo/School Linked Services Collaborative
- City of Daly City for the Daly City Collaborative
- City of East Palo Alto for the East Palo Alto Collaborative
- City of Menlo Park for the Belle Haven/Menlo Park Collaborative
- City of South San Francisco for the South San Francisco Collaborative
- Pacifica School District for the Pacifica Collaborative
- La Honda-Pescadero Unified District for the South Coast Collaborative
- Redwood City School District for the Redwood City Collaborative
- San Mateo-Foster City School District for the San Mateo Collaborative

## 5. Exhibit D – PROGRAM MONITORING for the term OCTOBER 1, 2001 through SEPTEMBER 30, 2004 is hereby amended to read as follows:

PCF will direct that the implementation of the San Mateo County Promoting Safe and Stable Families (PSSF) Program be monitored by the Peninsula Partnership for Children, Youth and Families (PPCYF) through written reports, regular contact with PPCYF staff and oversight by the Peninsula Partnership Council (PPC), PPCYF's advisory body.

The PSSF program will be implemented by collaborative teams at nine sites. The fiscal sponsor for each collaborative site will receive PSSF funds and will be responsible for submitting a Progress Report for the period from October 1, 2003 through June 30, 2004 and a Transition Report for the period from July 1, 2004 through September 30, 2004, outlining the implementation of its sustainability plan for comprehensive, integrated services for young children and their families. These written reports will include information regarding PSSF services delivered, PSSF funds expended and progress made towards PSSF goals. These written reports will also include information on the sustainability efforts that are outlined in the sustainability plans for each collaborative site.

A Manager, hired by PCF as an in-kind contribution, will report to PPCYF's Executive Director and PPC. The Manager will assist with program monitoring in the following ways:

- Stay in regular telephone and in-person contact with each of the nine collaborative sites.
- Provide hands-on assistance, helping the collaborative sites implement their sustainability plans, problem-solve and maintain collaboration.
- Assist the collaborative sites in developing and reporting outcome measurements.
- Broker additional technical assistance to provide training and other supports to the collaborative sites as needed, to be funded by PPCYF as an in-kind contribution.
- Facilitate cross-site trainings, seminars and peer-learning opportunities.
- Guide the collaborative sites regarding the goals, principles and requirements of PPCYF.
- Report collaborative sites' progress, issues and needs to PPC.

PPC will play a critical role in ensuring that PSSF funds received from the County under this Agreement are used to accomplish the goals of the PSSF program as well as the broader mission of PPCYF. PPC will hear reports from the Manager and will stay in direct contact with each of the nine collaborative sites through the site liaisons. PPC members will provide oversight and guidance to the collaborative sites to help them meet the mission, goals and principles of PPCYF.

The reports must also state the progress made towards achieving the outcomes of PPCYF. Please be as specific as possible, using the sustainability plan and its program matrix as a guide. Summaries of these reports will be used to provide information to funders.

Both the Progress Report and the Transition Report should be submitted to PPCYF in the following format:

- Single-spaced, Times New Roman, 12-point, 1" margins, consecutively numbered pages
- Two (2) reports: One (1) original unbound and one (1) electronic copy

Following are five (5) sections, which should be addressed in both the Progress Report and the Transition Report. Each section should not exceed two (2) pages.

#### Section I: Major Accomplishments and Activities for this Report Period

- B. Describe the population served by the project.
- C. Give examples of the progress made towards meeting PPCYF outcomes of: (1) kindergarten readiness; (2) academic success by third grade; and (3) community capacity-building. Using the sustainability plan and its program matrix as a guide, please be sure to include specific performance measures for each of these outcomesin the narrative of the report.
- D. Include all data collected during the report period. These data should be based upon the performance measures in the program matrix of the sustainability plan.
