Second Lease Amendment for Office Space at 1200 O'Brien in Menlo

Park, California for the Human Services Agency. (Lease No. 1223)

# Recommendation

Adopt a Resolution authorizing the President of the Board of Supervisors to execute a Second Lease Amendment with Opportunities Industrialization Center West for office space at 1200 O'Brien, Menlo Park, California.

#### **Background**

The Human Services Agency has operated the SUCCESS Program at 1200 O'Brien in Menlo Park since 1998. This facility accepts applications, provides SUCCESS counseling and determines ongoing eligibility for aid payments for the southern region of the County.

## **Discussion**

The Second Lease Amendment provides for the lease of one additional office of approximately 120 square feet, which will be used by HSA to alleviate overcrowding in adjacent areas of the premises. The increase in monthly rent is \$270 and is considered fair market rent. The term is through April 30, 2006, which was established under the terms of the First Amendment to Lease.

The Director of the Human Services Agency concurs in this recommendation. County Counsel has reviewed and approved the Second Lease Amendment as to form.
