## VI. Committees

#### A. LEGAL PROCESS

CO-CHAIRS: ELAINE TIPTON & DEBBIE APPEL

**Purpose**: To foster coordination and responsiveness of the legal and law enforcement systems working with victims of domestic violence and their children; increase access to and effectiveness of the legal system for self-represented litigants; ensure effective investigation, prosecution and judicial intervention in domestic violence cases; seek coordination of the civil and criminal legal systems involved in addressing domestic violence; continue to raise awareness within the legal system to issues of domestic violence.

## Currently:

- Providing valuable input, support and discussion of VIP coordinated response efforts

#### Future actions for 2004, 2005 & 2006:

- 1. Revise and update judicial benchcard for use by judicial officers handling domestic violence cases;
- 2. Provide bilingual (Spanish) materials for use in specified domestic violence court proceedings;

- 3. Increase law enforcement membership on committee;
- 4. Review, provide recommendations and support for technical advances in use of on-line Family Law forms;
- 5. Review, provide recommendations and support for Domestic Violence Law Enforcement Protocol;
- 6. Continue to provide forum for information sharing, response and solutions to issues within the domestic violence legal community.
- 7. Assess efficacy of Domestic Violence Prevention Act proceedings, including family law admonitions.

# B. CHILDREN-MULTICULTURAL-EDUCATION CO-CHAIRS: MARK LANE AND TAGI QOLOUVAKI

**Purpose**: To review and inventory currently existing systems and based on the inventory, recommend enhancements, coordination, or the development of new programs targeted at the children experiencing domestic violence. To continue to raise public, private, and professional awareness as to the needs of children experiencing domestic violence. (Since this charter was developed the Committee has expanded to include multi-cultural issues.)

#### 1. Committee Organization

- \* Expand membership by recruiting new members more representative of the demographics of the community.
- Evaluate the Committee process, involvement of members, and liaison process with Domestic Violence Council

#### 2. Violence in Families Initiative Program (VIP)

- ❖ Continue to function as VIP Oversight Committee.
- ❖ Plan for the continuation of the vital components of VIP by assisting in the institutionalization process of VIP.
- Continue to implement and expand VIP in the community.
- Utilize the needs assessment completed by Applied Survey Research (ASR) for planning, advocacy and community education.
- Provide input and oversight to the ASR needs assessment project.
- Support the development of protocols, policies and procedures of the VIP Response Task Force.

#### 3. Multicultural

- Compile and disseminate information in the community from the multicultural panel presentations.
- ❖ Begin to collect and compile data obtained at the multicultural panel presentations.
- ❖ Sponsor at least three multicultural panel discussions/trainings.

#### 4. Education

- Compile and distribute data to the community on the effects of children exposed to domestic violence.
- Educate and advocate for services for children and families affected by domestic violence.
- ❖ Advocate for and make funding recommendations to the Probation Trust Fund, First Five Commission and other funding sources regarding funding programs for children affected by domestic violence.

- 1. Review the Case Review form and finalize it for use.
- 2. Review the six pending cases for 2003 and any new cases.
- 3. Expand the review of cases to involve suicides/ family violence relating to deaths.
- 4. Work with the Legislative sub-committee to review legislation on sharing information at the Death review sub-committee.
- 5. Share regular reports with the Domestic Violence Council.
