BOARD OF SUPERVISORS, COUNTY OF SAN MATEO, STATE OF CALIFORNIA

Resolution Authorizing a Letter to be Sent to the Mayor of the City and County of San Francisco and to the President of the San Francisco Airport Commission Waste Reduction and Recycling Programs to be Included in the Airport's Proposed Waste and Recycling Services Contract

RESOLVED, by the Board of Supervisors of the County of San Mateo, State of California, that

WHEREAS, the County of San Mateo is required by State law to divert 50% of the waste stream from the unincorporated area; and

WHEREAS, San Francisco International Airport(Airport) is located within the

unincorporated area of San Mateo County; and

WHEREAS, approximately one third of the waste stream from the unincorporated area of San Mateo County is generated by San Francisco International Airport and its tenants; and

WHEREAS, the Director of San Francisco International Airport is currently preparing to call for bids for a five year waste and recycling services contract; and

WHEREAS, including programs in the Airport's five year waste and recycling services contract can result in a significant positive impact on the overall diversion rate for the Airport and County if implemented; and WHEREAS, the President of the Board has recommended that this Board authorize and send a letter to the Mayor of the City and County of San Francisco and to the Airport Director requesting that waste reduction and recycling actions be included in the Airport's proposed bid for waste and recycling services for the next five years; and

WHEREAS, this Board has considered the recommendation of the President of the Board.

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY DETERMINED AND ORDERED that the

President of this Board is authorized and directed to send a letter to the Mayor of the City and County of San Francisco, and to the President of the San Francisco Airport Commission requesting that general, food waste, and construction and demolition waste reduction and recycling programs be included in the Airport's proposed bid for waste and recycling services for the next five years.
