**SUBJECT:** Consent to Continuation of Term of Office on the Metropolitan

**Transportation Commission** 

## **Recommendation:**

Consent to the continuation of Supervisor Michael Nevin's current term of office as a member of the Metropolitan Transportation Commission, and direct the President of the Board to send a letter of consent to the Executive Officer of the Commission.

## Background:

Government Code section 66503 provides that the Board of Supervisors shall appoint one member to serve on the Metropolitan Transportation Commission and that the member so appointed may be an elected official. The term of office is four years. Government Code section 66504 provides that an appointing authority such as the Board of Supervisors may consent to the continuation of the term of office of a member who no longer holds a public office. Previously, the Board appointed Supervisor Michael Nevin to serve as a member of the Commission. Supervisor Nevin's Metropolitan Transportation Commission term would normally expire in February 2007. The Board may, however, consent to allow Supervisor Nevin to continue his term although he no longer holds public office as a member of the Board of Supervisors.

As the Board is well aware, Supervisor Nevin has special familiarity with the problems and issues in the field of transportation. It would be of great benefit to the citizens of the County for Supervisor Nevin to continue his service on the Metropolitan Transportation Commission.
