First Amendment to the Agreement With the San Mateo County Community College District

THIS FIRST AMENDMENT TO THE AGREEMENT, entered into this _30th day of __November_____, 2004, by and between the COUNTY OF SAN MATEO, hereinafter called "County," and San Mateo County Community College District, hereinafter called "Contractor";

$\underline{WITNESSETH}$:

WHEREAS, the Agreement with San Mateo County Community College was approved by the Board of Supervisors on January 19, 2004, for the purpose of providing biotechnology classes to dislocated workers in San Mateo County.

WHEREAS, the County and the Contractor wish to amend the Agreement to extend the term and the amount to provide a class to train an additional twenty (20) participants.

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY AGREED BY THE PARTIES HERETO AS FOLLOWS:

- 6. Section 3: Payments is hereby amended to read as follows:

In consideration of the services provided by Contractor in accordance with all terms, conditions and specification set forth herein and in Exhibit "A," County shall make payment to Contractor based on the rates and in the manner specified in Exhibits "B, B-1, B-2 and B-3." The County reserves the right to withhold payment if the County determines that the quantity or quality of the work performed is unacceptable. This First Amendment increases the Agreement by seventy three thousand one hundred ninety five dollars (\$73,195) to serve an additional 20 participants for a total fiscal obligation not to exceed one hundred eighty nine thousand one hundred ninety five dollars (\$189,195). 7. Section 4: <u>Term and Termination</u>, paragraph one is hereby amended to read as follows:

Subject to compliance with all terms and conditions, the term of this Agreement shall be from January 19, 2004 through **June 30, 2005**.

8. All other terms and conditions of the Agreement dated January 19, 2004 between the County and Contractor shall remain in full force and effect.

Description of Services San Mateo County Community College District January 19, 2004 through June 30, 2005

1. The Contractor shall provide three biotech training classes as described below:

- The start date of classes is to be determined and mutually agreed upon by the County and the Contractor.
- Two classes must be completed no later than December 30, 2004 and the spring 2005 class must be completed no later than June 30, 2005.
- Submit a report upon completion of each class outlining the official grade of each student and attendance.

Biotech Course Description

Participants will complete twelve (12) weeks of training and will be eligible for entrylevel employment at biotechnology corporations in the region. The twelve (12) week class will include a total of two hundred and four (204) hours of instruction for each participant. The faculty in this discipline will collaborate with other programs in the region to maximize the knowledge and employment opportunities for the participants. There must be a minimum of twenty (20) participants for the start-up of class. Considering that drop-outs may occur, the Contractor must maintain a class size of at least twelve (12) participants for class to continue.

Payment Schedule San Mateo County Community College District January 1, 2004 through June 30, 2005

A. Spring Class 2005 between December 31, 2004 and June 30, 2005:

The Contractor will conduct training for one (1) class (spring 2005). The total cost for the spring 2005 class and administration is \$73,195. Upon completion of training, the contractor will invoice the County for actual costs incurred not to exceed \$73,195. The total obligation for spring 2005 class described in Exhibit A, Exhibit B-2, Exhibit B-3 and this section shall not exceed \$73,195.

B. Total Agreement Obligation:

The total cost for services described in Exhibit A, Exhibit B, Exhibit B-2, Exhibit B-3 and in this Exhibit shall not exceed \$189,195.
