RESOLUTION ESTABLISHING A SMOKING POLICY FOR THE EXTERIOR AREAS
OF CERTAIN COUNTY OWNED BUILDINGS THAT ARE SUBJECT TO
LEADERSHIP IN ENERGY AND ENVIRONMENTAL DESIGN REQUIREMENTS

**RESOLVED, by the Board of** Supervisors of the County of San Mateo, State of California, that

WHEREAS, in 1990, San Mateo County adopted a comprehensive ordinance regulating the smoking of tobacco. Section 4.96.040 of that ordinance prohibits smoking within any enclosed structure owned or leased by San Mateo County and within thirty (30) feet of the main entrance(s) of any enclosed structure owned by San Mateo County as determined by the Director of Public Works; and

WHEREAS, in 2001, San Mateo County adopted a Sustainable Building Policy requiring the County to design, build and certify to the highest applicable Leadership in Energy and Environmental Design (LEED) rating, any County building of 5000 square feet or greater; and

WHEREAS, one of the prerequisites for a LEED rating requires that any exterior designated smoking areas must be at least 25 feet away from entries, outdoor intakes and operable windows of the building; and

WHEREAS, this Board finds that it is in the best interests of the health of County~ employees and the public using County buildings that these designated buildings achieve LEED ratings;

NOW THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY DETERMINED AND ORDERED that for the County's Crime Lab and the Office of the Coroner located at 50 Tower Road in San Mateo and for the Youth Services Center presently under construction in San Mateo, and any other County owned building that will be designated as part of the Leadership in Energy and Environmental Design program, in addition to the provisions of Chapter 4.96 of the San Mateo County Ordinance Code, there shall be no smoking within the (30) feet of all building entrances, operable windows, air intakes, and other openings serving the buildings where tobacco smoke could be introduced into the building.
