WHEREAS, FASD is entirely preventable with education and appropriate allocation of resources;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Board of Supervisors of San Mateo County declares September 9th, 2005 "Fetal Alcohol Spectrum Disorder Awareness Day" and wishes all its supporters the best in battling this terrible affliction.
