AMENDMENT ONE TO AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE COUNTY OF SAN MATEO AND SEQUOIA HOSPITAL

THIS AMENDMENT TO THE AGREEMENT, entered into this day of
, 20, by and between the COUNTY OF SAN MATEO,
hereinafter called "County," and the SEQUOIA HOSPITAL, hereinafter called
"Contractor":

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, pursuant to Government Code, Section 31000, County may contract with independent contractors for the furnishing of such services to or for County or any Department thereof;

WHEREAS, the parties entered into Agreement 68151 for a Health Promotion/Disease Prevention Program on July 18, 2006;

WHEREAS, the parties wish to amend the Agreement to add the creation and dubbing of a Sit and Be Fit Fall Prevention Workout video in Cantonese in the amount of \$4,800; and

WHEREAS, the parties wish to further amend the Agreement to add Section 23. Grievance Procedures:

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY AGREED BY THE PARTIES HERETO AS FOLLOWS:

1. Section 3 of the Original Agreement is amended to read as follows:

3. Payments.

In consideration of the services provided by Contractor in accordance with all terms, conditions and specifications set forth herein and in Schedule A (revised), County shall make payment to Contractor based on the rates and in the manner specified in Schedule B (revised). The County reserves the right to withhold payment if the County determines that the quantity or quality of the work performed is unacceptable. In no event shall the County's total fiscal obligation under this Agreement exceed TEN THOUSAND ONE HUNDRED FIVE DOLLARS (\$10,105).

2. Section 23 is added to the Original Agreement as follows:

23. Grievance Procedures

Consumers of services funded through Aging and Adult Services (AAS) shall have the opportunity to file a written complaint against an AAS-funded program or an employee or volunteer of that program. All service providers must have a

FY 2006-2007 DESCRIPTION OF SERVICES

Contractor shall operate the following Older Americans Act (OAA) Program: the health Promotion/Disease Prevention Program. Services described in this Schedule A reflect program performance requirements (units of service) during fiscal year July 1, 2006 through June 30, 2007. This program shall operate in accordance with the California Department of Aging and/or state licensing regulations and the standards and requirements established by Aging and Adult Services of San Mateo County. A monitoring will be conducted annually and onsite, in accordance with the Area Agency on Aging Contract Monitoring Procedures Manual. Contractor agrees to provide requested programmatic and administrative documentation as part of the contract monitoring process.

I. HEALTH PROMOTION/DISEASE PREVENTION PROGRAM

A. Units of Service

Contractor agrees to provide 100 unduplicated clients with 70 units of community education/advocacy relating to fall prevention and 10 units of health screening.

Contractor agrees to create and dub a Sit and Be Fit Fall Prevention Workout video in Cantonese (300 copies).

B. Unit Definitions

Community Education/Advocacy: This activity includes educational presentations on specific health-related topics such as smoking cessation, cancer prevention, nutrition, etc.

Unit of Service: One hour

Health Screening: To provide a brief examination to determine need for more in-depth medical evaluation and referral when appropriate.

Unit of Service: One hour

Sit and Be Fit Fall Prevention Workout Video: To provide a Sit and Be

Fit Fall Prevention Workout video in Cantonese.

Unit of Service: One video

C. Program Requirements

Contractor agrees to:

FY 2006-2007 FISCAL SUMMARY

Contractor shall operate the following Older Americans Act (OAA) and/or Community-Based Services (CBSP) programs(s): the Health Promotion/Disease Prevention Program. Services described in this Schedule B reflect program funding and payment method during fiscal year July 1, 2006 through June 30, 2007. This program shall operate in accordance with the California Department of Aging and/or state licensing regulations, applicable federal laws, and the standards and requirements established by Aging and Adult Services of San Mateo County.

I. HEALTH PROMOTION/DISEASE PREVENTION PROGRAM

Aging and Adult Services (AAS) will pay the contractor in consideration of Health Promotion/Disease Prevention Program services rendered through OAA funds, the rate of one-twelfth of the total reimbursement for this program per month, as long as this amount does not exceed the total cost of Health Promotion/Disease Prevention Program services rendered.

AAS will pay contractor \$4,800 for the creation and dubbing of a Sit and Be Fit Fall Prevention Workout video in Cantonese (300 copies).

The maximum reimbursement for the Health Promotion/Disease Prevention Program during the contract term July 1, 2006 through June 30, 2007 shall not exceed FIVE THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$9,800).

Contractor agrees to the following:

- A. Contractor is responsible for covering the cost of all components of each program outlined above and shall be reimbursed for actual expenditures on the approved budget for each program;
- B. A mid-year review, scheduled for January, will require a reconciliation of year-todate outcomes. Based on these outcomes, a budget revision may be required;
- C. Submit client intake forms as appropriate, monthly program reports and invoices by the tenth (10th) of each month. (Invoices submitted more than two months past the month of service may not be reimbursed. Statistical reports submitted more than one month past the month of service may result in withholding of payments until reports are brought current.);

- D. Offer services throughout the twelve-month contract period, unless prior written approval is received from Aging and Adult Services;
- E. Submit a closing report by July 31, 2007;
- F. Program Income must be reported and expended under the same terms and conditions as the program funds from which it is generated; and
- G. Program Income must be used to pay for current allowable costs of the program in the same fiscal year that the income was earned.

The maximum reimbursement for contracted services between San Mateo County Aging and Adult Services and Sequoia Hospital is \$9,800 in OAA funds, and \$305 in County General Funds for general program support for a total amount of TEN THOUSAND ONE HUNDRED FIVE DOLLARS (\$10,105) for the contract term July 1, 2006 through June 30, 2007.
