2. Section 1: <u>Services to be performed by Contractor</u> is hereby amended to read as follows:

In consideration of the payments hereinafter set forth, Contractor shall perform services for County in accordance with the terms, conditions and specifications set forth herein and in Exhibit "A" and Exhibit "A1" attached hereto for the COUNTY OF SAN

MATEO HUMAN SERVICES AGENCY. Contractor shall ensure compliance with all state, federal and local laws or rules applicable to performance of the work required under this contract.

3. Section 2: <u>Contract Term</u> is hereby amended to read as follows:

The term of this Agreement shall be from **September 25, 2007** to **August 30, 2008** unless terminated earlier by the County.

4. Section 3: Payments is hereby amended to read as follows:

In consideration of the services rendered in accordance with all terms, conditions and specifications set forth herein and in Exhibit "A", County shall make payment to Contractor in the manner specified herein and in Exhibit "A" and Exhibit "A1." In the event that the County makes any advance payments, Contractor agrees to refund any amounts in excess of the amount owed by the County at the time of contract termination. The County reserves the right to withhold payment if the County determines that the quantity or quality of the work performed is unacceptable. A total of one hundred thirty thousand nine hundred ninety nine dollars (\$130,999) is hereby added as follows through this First Amendment: fifty one thousand fifty four dollars (\$51,054) for a single session of the Gateway Program and seventy nine thousand nine hundred forty five dollars (\$79,945) for a single session of the Bio-Manufacturing Program. In no event shall total payment for services under this Agreement exceed the original Agreement amount of ninety eight thousand nine hundred forty six dollars (\$98,946) for the original Gateway Program session and the added amount of one hundred thirty thousand nine hundred ninety nine dollars (\$130,999) for a total obligation of two hundred twenty nine thousand nine hundred forty five dollars (\$229,945).

5. Section 15: Merger Clause is hereby amended to read as follows:

This Agreement, including Exhibit "A" and **Exhibit "A1"** attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference, constitutes the sole Agreement of the parties hereto and correctly states the rights, duties, and obligations of each party as of this document's date. Any prior agreement, promises, negotiations, or representations between the parties not expressly stated in this document are not binding. All subsequent modifications shall be in writing and signed by the County Purchasing Agent. In the event that any term, condition, provision, requirement or specification set forth in this body of the agreement conflicts with or is inconsistent with any term, condition, provision, requirement or specification in any exhibit and/or attachment to this agreement, the provisions of this body of the agreement shall prevail. This Agreement, or facsimile proposal of the Agreement, constitutes the entire Agreement between County and Contractor. Further, liability referenced to in section 6 is limited to Contractor's negligence during the Contractor's performance under this contract.

- 7. Exhibit A1 is hereby added which is attached hereto and incorporated by reference herein.

Agreement between the County of San Mateo and San Mateo Community College District

I. Description of Services to be Performed by the Contractor for the Gateway Program

The Contractor through its Skyline College shall administer classes under the Gateway Program as described below:

The Gateway Program is a contextualized basic skills program aimed at preparing Workforce Investment act participants to satisfy the math and English prerequisites for the Bio-Manufacturing Certificate Program or other Biotech related degree programs.

Course Start-up Requirements:

- 1. The start date of classes are to be determined and mutually agreed upon by the County and Contractor;
- 2. Must be completed by the end of Spring 2008;
- 3. The number of students for class start-up and continuation will be determined and agreed upon by both parties; a minimum of 20 students must be enrolled:
- 4. A seventeen (17) week "Program Learning Community Cohort Model" that includes twelve (12) units of college credit and includes the classes shown under the Gateway Program below:

Gateway Program Courses:

In administering the Gateway Program the Contractor will offer the following classes at its Skyline College facility to Gateway Program participants:

•	CRER 650	Career Planning
•	ENGL 826	Basic Writing Skills
•	LSKL 853	Writing and Reading Assistance Lab
•	MATH811	Fundamentals of Mathematics
•	READ826	Reading Improvement

Reporting Requirements

The Contractor shall for each Gateway Program participant:

- 1. Provide monthly updates by report to the County regarding progress and attendance; and
- 2. Submit a final report upon completion of the class outlining the official grade and attendance.

II. Amount and Method of Payment

The Contractor will receive payment in the amount of \$98,946 for the Fall 2007 Gateway Program Session by January 2008. The total cost for services for the Spring 2008 session of the Gateway Program as shown in Section I of Exhibit A including taxes and any fees is \$51,054 as outlined in Attachment H. The County shall pay the Contractor one lump sum of \$51,054 for the Spring 2008 Gateway Program session upon completion of service, submittal of final report and receipt of invoice. Services, taxes and any fees for the Gateway Program shall not exceed \$150,000.

Total combined services for the Gateway Program shown in Exhibit A and Bio-Manufacturing Certificate Program shown in Exhibit A1 shall not exceed the Agreement amount of \$229,945.

I. Description of Services to be Performed by the Contractor for the Bio-Manufacturing Certificate Program

The Contractor through its Skyline College shall administer classes under the Bio-Manufacturing Certificate Program as described below:

The Bio-Manufacturing Certificate Program includes a 17-week classroom and lab instructional design. The program prepares graduates for employment in the Biotech, Pharmaceutical Marketing and Manufacturing Quality Control in a variety of manufacturing positions

Course Start-up Requirements:

- 1. The start date of classes are to be determined and mutually agreed upon by the County and Contractor;
- 2. Must be completed by the end of Spring 2008;
- 3. The number of students for class start-up and continuation will be determined and agreed upon by both parties; a minimum of 20 students must be enrolled.
- 4. A seventeen (17) week Program that includes twelve (12) units of college credit and two hundred forty (240) hours of instruction for each participant. Participants successfully completing this Program will be trained for entry-level employment at biotechnology corporations in the region. The Bio-Manufacturing Certificate Program includes the classes shown under the Bio-Manufacturing Certificate Program below:

In administering the Bio-Manufacturing Certificate Program the Contractor will offer the following classes at its Skyline College facility to Bio-Manufacturing participants:

BIOL 415 Intro to Biotechnology Manufacturing

MATH 650 MathematicsCRE 132 Job Search

Reporting Requirements

The Contractor shall for each Bio-Manufacturing participant:

- 1. Provide monthly updates by report to the County regarding progress and attendance; and
- 2. Submit a final report upon completion of the class outlining the official grade and attendance.

II. Amount and Method of Payment

The total cost for services, taxes and any fees for the Bio-Manufacturing Certificate Program as shown in Section 1 of Exhibit A1 is \$79,945 and as outlined in Attachment G. The County shall pay the Contractor one lump sum of \$79,945 for the Bio-Manufacturing Certificate Program upon completion of service, submittal of final report, and receipt of invoice. Services for the Bio-Manufacturing Certificate Program, taxes and any fees shall not exceed \$79.945.

Total combined services for the Gateway Program shown in Exhibit A and Bio-Manufacturing Certificate Program shown in Exhibit A1 shall not exceed the Agreement amount of \$229,945.
