AN AMENDMENT TO THE AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE COUNTY OF SAN MATEO AND EDGEWOOD CENTER FOR CHILDREN AND FAMILIES

THIS AMENDMENT TO THE AGREEMENT, entered into this day of
, 20, by and between the COUNTY OF SAN MATEO,
hereinafter called "County," and EDGEWOOD CENTER FOR CHILDREN AND
FAMILIES (ECCF), hereinafter called "Contractor";

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, pursuant to Government Code, Section 31000, County may contract with independent contractors for the furnishing of such services to or for County or any Department thereof;

WHEREAS, it is necessary and desirable that Contractor be retained for the purpose of Kinship services.

WHEREAS, on October 24, 2006, the Board of Supervisors approved an Agreement, Resolution Number 68358 in the amount of \$490,056 for the term July 1, 2006 through June 30, 2008, wherein ECCF agreed to provide administration of Kinship Support Services Program (KSSP) and Kinship Guardian Assistance Payment Program (KinGAP);.and

WHEREAS, on June 5, 2007, the Board of Supervisors approved an Amendment to the Agreement, Resolution Number 68768 in the amount of \$653,396 for a new total obligation of \$1,143,452 and extended the term to June 30, 2008;, wherein ECCF was to provide additional respite services in FY 2006-07 and continue providing KSSP and KinGAP services for FY 2007-08; and

WHEREAS, the parties wish to enter into a Second Amendment to add funds to provide increased respite and other services for FY 2007-08 in the amount of \$43,375 for a new total obligation of \$1,186,827.

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY AGREED BY THE PARTIES HERETO AS FOLLOWS:

1. Paragraph 3 ("Payments") is hereby amended and restated in its entirety as follows:

In consideration of the services provided by Contractor in accordance with all terms, conditions and specifications set forth herein and in Exhibit "A1," County shall make payment to Contractor based on the rates and in the manner specified in Exhibit "B1." In the event that the County makes any advance payments, Contractor agrees to refund any amounts in excess of the amount owed by the County at the time of contract termination. The County reserves the right to withhold payment if the County determines that the quantity or quality of the work performed is unacceptable. In no event shall the County's total fiscal obligation under this Agreement exceed **ONE MILLION ONE HUNDRED EIGHTY SIX THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED TWENTY SEVEN DOLLARS (\$1,186,827).**

Edgewood Center for Children and Families July 1, 2006 through June 30, 2008 Payment Schedule

- A. As of to date the Contractor has received payments for FY 2006-07 \$634,416.66 and for FY 2007-08 for the period of July 1, 2007 through February 29, 2008 \$309,925.19.
- B. In consideration of the services provided by Contractor in Exhibit "A2", County shall pay Contractor as follows for the remainder of FY 2007-08, March 1, 2008 through June 30, 2008. County shall pay Contractor for actual Operational and Other Direct Costs will not exceed NINETY THREE THOUSAND FOUR HUNDRED TWENTY NINE DOLLARS (\$93,429). Contractor will provide monthly invoice for the actual expenditures for the Operational and Other Direct Costs. All payments under this Agreement must directly support services specified in this Agreement.
- C. County shall pay Contractor for actual salaries and benefits associated with required program staffing as described in Exhibit A2 for the remainder of FY 2007-08, March 1, 2008 through June 30, 2008. Costs will not exceed ONE HUNDRED FORTY THREE THOUSAND FOUR HUNDRED SIXTEEN DOLLARS (\$143,416) for FY 2007-08. Contractor must provide detailed invoice with actual salaries and benefits for each staff on a format as specified by the County.
- D. In no event shall the total amount exceed for FY 2007-08 FIVE HUNDRED FORTY SIX THOUSAND SEVEN HUNDRED SEVENTY ONE DOLLARS (\$546,771).
- E. In no event shall the total contract amount exceed ONE MILLION ONE HUNDRED EIGHTY SIX THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED TWENTY SEVEN DOLLARS (\$1,186,827) for the term of the Agreement.
- F. Invoices shall be sent to: April Dunham, Human Services Manager, County of San Mateo, Human Services Agency, 400 Harbor Blvd., Bldg. B, and Belmont, CA 94002. Payments shall be made within thirty (30) working days upon receipt of Contractor's invoice.
- G. County may withhold all or part of Contractor's total payment if the Director of Human Services or his designee reasonably determines that Contractor has not satisfactorily performed the services described in Exhibit A2.

- H. County will give thirty (30) days prior written notice to Contractor of County's intent to withhold payment.
- I. If County reasonably determines that circumstances warrant immediate action, County may withhold payment immediately, without the thirty (30) day waiting period, County's written notice with justification to Contractor.

2. Contractor will submit quarterly activity report as follows:

January 15, 2008, April 15, 2008, and July 15, 2008

- 3. Contractor will submit a Mid-year Narrative and a Year-end Narrative Report due on January 15, 2008.
- 4. Contractor will submit a financial audit to the Contract Monitor as soon as it becomes available.
- 5. The Human Services Agency Contract Monitor will conduct site visit during the term of the Agreement to review all aspects of program operations and review Contractor's documentation related to required reports. This site visit will be arranged in advance with the Director of Edgewood Center for Children and Families.
