

**AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE COUNTY OF SAN MATEO AND  
SHELTER NETWORK**

THIS AGREEMENT, entered into this \_\_\_\_\_ day of \_\_\_\_\_ ,  
20\_\_\_\_\_, by and between the COUNTY OF SAN MATEO, hereinafter called  
"County," and SHELTER NETWORK, hereinafter called "Contractor";

W I T N E S S E T H:

WHEREAS, pursuant to Government Code, Section 31000, County may contract with independent contractors for the furnishing of such services to or for County or any Department thereof;

WHEREAS, it is necessary and desirable that Contractor be retained for the purpose of professional services hereinafter described for the Behavioral Health and Recovery Services Division of the Health Department.

**NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY AGREED BY THE PARTIES HERETO AS FOLLOWS:**

**1. Exhibits and Attachments**

The following exhibits and attachments are included hereto and incorporated by reference herein:

Exhibit A—Services

Exhibit B—Payments and rates

Attachment E—Fingerprinting Certification

Attachment I—§ 504 Compliance

**2. Services to be performed by Contractor**

In consideration of the payments set forth herein and in Exhibit "B," Contractor shall perform services for County in accordance with the terms, conditions and specifications set forth herein and in Exhibit "A."

**3. Payments**

In consideration of the services provided by Contractor in accordance with all terms, conditions and specifications set forth herein and in Exhibit "A," County shall make payment to Contractor based on the rates and in the manner specified in Exhibit "B." The County reserves the right to withhold payment if the County determines that the quantity or quality of the work performed is unacceptable. In no event shall the County's total fiscal obligation under this Agreement exceed ONE HUNDRED SIXTY-EIGHT THOUSAND TWO HUNDRED TEN DOLLARS (\$168,210).

#### **4. Term and Termination**

Subject to compliance with all terms and conditions, the term of this Agreement shall be from July 1, 2008 through June 30, 2009.

This Agreement may be terminated by Contractor, the Director of Health or designee at any time without a requirement of good cause upon thirty (30) days' written notice to the other party.

In the event of termination, all finished or unfinished documents, data, studies, maps, photographs, reports, and materials (hereafter referred to as materials) prepared by Contractor under this Agreement shall become the property of the County and shall be promptly delivered to the County. Upon termination, the Contractor may make and retain a copy of such materials. Subject to availability of funding, Contractor shall be entitled to receive payment for work/services provided prior to termination of the Agreement. Such payment shall be that portion of the full payment which is determined by comparing the work/services completed to the work/services required by the Agreement.

#### **5. Availability of Funds**

The County may terminate this Agreement or a portion of the services referenced in the Attachments and Exhibits based upon unavailability of Federal, State, or County funds, by providing written notice to Contractor as soon as is reasonably possible after the County learns of said unavailability of outside funding.

#### **6. Relationship of Parties**

Contractor agrees and understands that the work/services performed under this Agreement are performed as an independent Contractor and not as an employee of the County and that Contractor acquires none of the rights, privileges, powers, or advantages of County employees.

#### **7. Hold Harmless**

Contractor shall indemnify and save harmless County, its officers, agents, employees, and servants from all claims, suits, or actions of every name, kind, and description, brought for, or on account of: (A) injuries to or death of any person, including Contractor, or (B) damage to any property of any kind whatsoever and to whomsoever belonging, (C) any sanctions, penalties, or claims of damages resulting from Contractor's failure to comply with the requirements set forth in the Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act of 1996 (HIPAA) and all Federal regulations promulgated thereunder, as amended, or (D) any other loss or cost, including but not limited to that caused by the concurrent active or passive negligence of County, its officers, agents, employees, or servants, resulting from the performance of any work required of Contractor or payments made pursuant to this Agreement, provided that this shall not apply to injuries or damage for which County has been found in a court of competent jurisdiction to be solely liable by reason of its own negligence or willful misconduct.

The duty of Contractor to indemnify and save harmless as set forth herein, shall include the duty to defend as set forth in Section 2778 of the California Civil Code.

**8. Assignability and Subcontracting**

Contractor shall not assign this Agreement or any portion thereof to a third party or subcontract with a third party to provide services required by contractor under this Agreement without the prior written consent of County. Any such assignment or subcontract without the County's prior written consent shall give County the right to automatically and immediately terminate this Agreement.

**9. Insurance**

The Contractor shall not commence work or be required to commence work under this Agreement unless and until all insurance required under this paragraph has been obtained and such insurance has been approved by Risk Management, and Contractor shall use diligence to obtain such insurance and to obtain such approval. The Contractor shall furnish the Department/Division with certificates of insurance evidencing the required coverage, and there shall be a specific contractual liability endorsement extending the Contractor's coverage to include the contractual liability assumed by the Contractor pursuant to this Agreement. These certificates shall specify or be endorsed to provide that thirty (30) days' notice must be given, in writing, to the Department/Division of any pending change in the limits of liability or of any cancellation or modification of the policy.

- (1) **Worker's Compensation and Employer's Liability Insurance** The Contractor shall have in effect during the entire life of this Agreement Workers' Compensation and Employer's Liability Insurance providing full statutory coverage. In signing this Agreement, the Contractor certifies, as required by Section 1861 of the California Labor Code, that it is aware of the provisions of Section 3700 of the California Labor Code which requires every employer to be insured against liability for Worker's Compensation or to undertake self-insurance in accordance with the provisions of the Code, and I will comply with such provisions before commencing the performance of the work of this Agreement.
- (2) **Liability Insurance** The Contractor shall take out and maintain during the life of this Agreement such Bodily Injury Liability and Property Damage Liability Insurance as shall protect him/her while performing work covered by this Agreement from any and all claims for damages for bodily injury, including accidental death, as well as any and all claims for property damage which may arise from contractors operations under this Agreement, whether such operations be by himself/herself or by any sub-contractor or by anyone directly or indirectly employed by either of them. Such insurance shall be combined single limit bodily injury and property damage for each occurrence and shall be not less than the amount specified below.

Such insurance shall include:

(a) Comprehensive General Liability . . . . .	\$1,000,000
(b) Motor Vehicle Liability Insurance . . . . .	\$1,000,000
(c) Professional Liability . . . . .	\$1,000,000

County and its officers, agents, employees and servants shall be named as additional insured on any such policies of insurance, which shall also contain a provision that the insurance afforded thereby to the County, its officers, agents, employees and servants shall be primary insurance to the full limits of liability of the policy, and that if the County or its officers and employees have other insurance against the loss covered by such a policy, such other insurance shall be excess insurance only.

In the event of the breach of any provision of this section, or in the event any notice is received which indicates any required insurance coverage will be diminished or canceled, the County of San Mateo at its option, may, notwithstanding any other provision of this Agreement to the contrary, immediately declare a material breach of this Agreement and suspend all further work pursuant to this Agreement.

**10. Compliance with laws; payment of Permits/Licenses**

All services to be performed by Contractor pursuant to this Agreement shall be performed in accordance with all applicable Federal, State, County, and municipal laws, including, but not limited to, Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act of 1996 (HIPAA) and all Federal regulations promulgated thereunder, as amended, and the Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990, as amended, and Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973, as amended and attached hereto and incorporated by reference herein as Attachment "I," which prohibits discrimination on the basis of handicap in programs and activities receiving any Federal or County financial assistance. Such services shall also be performed in accordance with all applicable ordinances and regulations, including, but not limited to, appropriate licensure, certification regulations, provisions pertaining to confidentiality of records, and applicable quality assurance regulations.

In the event of a conflict between the terms of this agreement and State, Federal, County, or municipal law or regulations, the requirements of the applicable law will take precedence over the requirements set forth in this Agreement.

Contractor will timely and accurately complete, sign, and submit all necessary documentation of compliance.

**11. Non-Discrimination and Other Requirements**

A. *Section 504 applies only to Contractor who are providing services to members of the public.* Contractor shall comply with § 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973, which provides that no otherwise qualified handicapped individual shall, solely by reason of a disability, be excluded from the participation in, be denied the benefits of, or be subjected to discrimination in the performance of this Agreement.

- B. *General non-discrimination.* No person shall, on the grounds of race, color, religion, ancestry, gender, age (over 40), national origin, medical condition (cancer), physical or mental disability, sexual orientation, pregnancy, childbirth or related medical condition, marital status, or political affiliation be denied any benefits or subject to discrimination under this Agreement.
- C. *Equal employment opportunity.* Contractor shall ensure equal employment opportunity based on objective standards of recruitment, classification, selection, promotion, compensation, performance evaluation, and management relations for all employees under this Agreement. Contractor's equal employment policies shall be made available to County of San Mateo upon request.
- D. *Violation of Non-discrimination provisions.* Violation of the non-discrimination provisions of this Agreement shall be considered a breach of this Agreement and subject the Contractor to penalties, to be determined by the County Manager, including but not limited to
  - i) termination of this Agreement;
  - ii) disqualification of the Contractor from bidding on or being awarded a County contract for a period of up to 3 years;
  - iii) liquidated damages of \$2,500 per violation;
  - iv) imposition of other appropriate contractual and civil remedies and sanctions, as determined by the County Manager.

To effectuate the provisions of this section, the County Manager shall have the authority to examine Contractor's employment records with respect to compliance with this paragraph and/or to set off all or any portion of the amount described in this paragraph against amounts due to Contractor under the Contract or any other Contract between Contractor and County.

Contractor shall report to the County Manager the filing by any person in any court of any complaint of discrimination or the filing by any person of any and all charges with the Equal Employment Opportunity Commission, the Fair Employment and Housing Commission or any other entity charged with the investigation of allegations within 30 days of such filing, provided that within such 30 days such entity has not notified Contractor that such charges are dismissed or otherwise unfounded. Such notification shall include the name of the complainant, a copy of such complaint, and a description of the circumstance. Contractor shall provide County with a copy of their response to the Complaint when filed.

- E. *Compliance with Equal Benefits Ordinance.* With respect to the provision of employee benefits, Contractor shall comply with the County Ordinance which prohibits contractors from discriminating in the provision of employee benefits between an employee with a domestic partner and an employee with a spouse.
- F. The Contractor shall comply fully with the non-discrimination requirements required by 41 CFR 60-741.5(a), which is incorporated herein as if fully set forth.

**12. Compliance with Contractor Employee Jury Service Ordinance**

Contractor shall comply with the County Ordinance with respect to provision of jury duty pay to employees and have and adhere to a written policy that provides that its employees shall receive from the contractor, on an annual basis, no less than five days of regular pay for actual jury service in San Mateo County. The policy may provide that employees deposit any fees received for such jury service with the contractor or that the contractor deduct from the employees regular pay the fees received for jury service.

**13. Retention of Records, Right to Monitor and Audit**

(a) CONTRACTOR shall maintain all required records for three (3) years after the COUNTY makes final payment and all other pending matters are closed, and shall be subject to the examination and/or audit of the County, a Federal grantor agency, and the State of California.

(b) Reporting and Record Keeping: CONTRACTOR shall comply with all program and fiscal reporting requirements set forth by appropriate Federal, State and local agencies, and as required by the COUNTY.

(c) CONTRACTOR agrees to provide to COUNTY, to any Federal or State department having monitoring or review authority, to COUNTY'S authorized representatives, and/or their appropriate audit agencies upon reasonable notice, access to and the right to examine all records and documents necessary to determine compliance with relevant Federal, State, and local statutes, rules and regulations, and this Agreement, and to evaluate the quality, appropriateness and timeliness of services performed.

**14. Merger Clause**

This Agreement, including the Exhibits attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference, constitutes the sole Agreement of the parties hereto and correctly states the rights, duties, and obligations of each party as of this document's date. In the event that any term, condition, provision, requirement or specification set forth in this body of the agreement conflicts with or is inconsistent with any term, condition, provision, requirement or specification in any exhibit and/or attachment to this agreement, the provisions of this body of the agreement shall prevail. Any prior agreement, promises, negotiations, or representations between the parties not expressly stated in this document are not binding. All subsequent modifications shall be in writing and signed by the parties.

**15. Controlling Law**

The validity of this Agreement and of its terms or provisions, as well as the rights and duties of the parties hereunder, the interpretation, and performance of this Agreement shall be governed by the laws of the State of California.

**16. Notices**

Any notice, request, demand, or other communication required or permitted

hereunder shall be deemed to be properly given when deposited in the United States mail, postage prepaid, or when deposited with a public telegraph company for transmittal, charges prepaid, addressed to:

EXHIBIT A  
FY 2008 - 2009

In consideration of the payments set forth in Exhibit "B", Contractor shall provide the following services:

I. DESCRIPTION OF SERVICES TO BE PERFORMED BY CONTRACTOR

A. Transitional Beds - Maple Street Shelter

1. Contractor shall provide five (5) dedicated transitional beds per night and one (1) fee-for-service transitional bed per night on an as-needed basis. Should additional transitional beds be available, County has the option to purchase such additional beds on an as-needed basis. Referrals for the use of these beds must come through Behavioral Health and Recovery Services (BHRS) Resource Management.
2. Transitional Beds Services
  - a. The clients placed in these beds will have full access to the shelter for services, which shall include case management services. Beds shall be in private cubicles, which shall include a dresser and a lamp.
  - b. Case management services shall include an initial assessment of fiscal resources, job skills and opportunities, and the need for referrals to other service providers. Referrals to substance abuse services and/or other services will be made on an as needed basis.
  - c. At Contractor's discretion, clients shall be transferred to Contractor's long-term shelter. Long-term shelter services are not to be provided through this agreement.

B. Pathways for Women

1. Transitional Beds



Contractor shall provide two (2) dedicated transitional beds per night. Should additional transitional beds be available, County has the option to purchase such additional beds on an as-needed basis. Clients utilizing these transitional bed services shall also receive services as described in Paragraph I.A.3. of this Exhibit A.

2. Haven House

- a. Contractor shall provide one (1) dedicated one (1) bedroom furnished apartment at 260 Van Buren Road, Haven House, Menlo Park, CA.
- b. Contractor shall provide supported housing services for families which will include children.

3. Programmatic Support

Contractor Program Administrator and clinical staff shall attend and participate in programmatic/clinical meetings for Pathways for Women.

4. Childcare Services

Contractor shall provide childcare services for women in the Pathways for Women program while they are attending clinical activities and meetings.

C. Administrative Requirements

- 1. Paragraph 13 of the Agreement notwithstanding, Contractor shall maintain medical records required by the California Code of Regulations. Notwithstanding the foregoing, Contractor shall maintain beneficiary medical and/or clinical records for a period of seven (7) years, except that the records of persons under age eighteen (18) at the time of treatment shall be maintained:
  - a) until one (1) year beyond the person's eighteenth (18<sup>th</sup>) birthday or
  - b) for a period of seven (7) years beyond the date of discharge, whichever is later.

2. Administering Satisfaction Surveys

Contractor agrees to administer/utilize any and all survey instruments as directed by the County BHRIS, including outcomes and satisfaction measurement instruments.

3. Cultural Competency
  - a. All program staff shall receive at least one (1) in-service training per year on some aspect of providing culturally and linguistically appropriate services. At least once per year and upon request, Contractor shall provide County with a schedule of in-service training(s) and a list of participants at each such training;
  - b. Contractor shall use good faith efforts to translate health-related materials in a culturally and linguistically appropriate manner. At least once per year and upon request, Contractor shall provide to County copies of Contractor's health-related materials in English and as translated; and
  - c. Contractor shall use good faith efforts to hire clinical staff members who can communicate with clients in a culturally and linguistically appropriate manner. At least once per year and upon request, Contractor shall submit to County the cultural composition and linguistic fluencies of Contractor's staff.
4. Contractor shall submit a copy of any licensing report issued by a licensing agency to County BHRS Adult Services Deputy Director within ten (10) business days of Contractor's receipt of any such licensing report.
5. Contractor may not employ any persons deemed an Ineligible Person by the Office of the Inspector General in the provision of services for the County through this agreement. Any employee(s) of contractor determined to be an Ineligible Person will be removed from responsibility for, or involvement with County clients or operations. An "Ineligible Person" is an individual who (1) is currently excluded, suspended, debarred or otherwise ineligible to participate in Federal health care programs, or (2) has been convicted of a criminal offense related to the provision of health care items or services and has not been reinstated in the Federal health care programs after a period of exclusion, suspension, debarment or ineligibility. Ineligibility may be verified by checking: [www.Exclusions.OIG.HHS.Gov](http://www.Exclusions.OIG.HHS.Gov).

6. Contractors providing state funded health services may not employ any persons deemed an Ineligible Person by the California Department of Health Services (CDHS) in the provision of services for the County through this agreement. Any employee(s) of contractor determined to be an Ineligible Person will be removed from responsibility for, or involvement with County clients or operations. An "Ineligible Person" is an individual who has been (1) convicted of a crime involving fraud or abuse of the Medi-Cal program, or (2) suspended from the federal Medicare program for any reason. 7. Fingerprint Certification

At County's sole discretion, Contractor certifies that its employees and/or its subcontractors, assignees, and volunteers who, during the course of performing services under this Agreement, have contact with children, will be fingerprinted in order to determine whether they have a criminal history which would compromise the safety of children with whom Contractor's employees and/or its subcontractors, assignees, or volunteers have contact. If said employees and/or subcontractors, assignees, and volunteers have such a criminal history, they shall not have contact with children who receive services through this agreement. A certificate of fingerprinting certification is attached hereto and incorporated by reference herein as Attachment E.

8. Goals and Objectives

Contractor shall ensure that the following outcomes are pursued throughout the term of this Agreement:

Shelter Services

Goal: Contractor shall increase the independence of clients by assisting them in obtaining any and all necessary support services (e.g., financial assistance, housing, medical/psychiatric services, etc.) to facilitate a higher level of self-sufficiency.

Objective: A minimum of sixty-five percent (65%) of clients shall obtain stable (permanent or transitional) housing upon discharge.

Data collection to be completed by the Contractor.

Pathways for Women

Goal: Contractor shall support the reunification of clients with their children

Objective: A minimum of ninety percent (90%) of clients residing in Haven House shall participate in parenting classes.

Data collection to be completed by the Contractor.

EXHIBIT B  
2008 - 2009

I. In consideration of the services provided by Contractor in Exhibit "A", County shall pay Contractor based on the following fee schedule:

A. Rates for Services

1. Transitional Beds – Maple Street Shelter

Contractor shall provide five (5) dedicated transitional beds per night and one (1) fee-for-service transitional bed per night at the rate of FORTY-FIVE DOLLARS (\$45) per bed per night. Should additional transitional beds be available, County has the option to purchase on an as-needed basis such additional beds at the same rates as the dedicated beds. Contractor shall invoice County on a monthly basis for these emergency shelter and transitional beds.

2. Pathways for Women

a. Transitional Beds

Contractor shall provide two (2) transitional beds per night at the rate of FIFTY DOLLARS (\$50) per bed per night. Should additional transitional beds be available, County has the option to purchase on an as-needed basis such additional beds at the same rates as the dedicated beds. Contractor shall invoice County on a monthly basis for these emergency shelter and transitional beds. Payments shall be made only for services authorized by BHRS Deputy Director of Adult Services or designee.

b. Haven House

- 1) Contractor shall provide one (1), one (1) bedroom furnished apartment at 260 Van Buren Road, Haven House, Menlo Park, CA, at the rate of ONE THOUSAND TWO HUNDRED TWENTY-SEVEN DOLLARS (\$1,227) per month, not to exceed the total amount of FOURTEEN THOUSAND SEVEN HUNDRED TWENTY-FOUR DOLLARS (\$14,724). Payments shall be made only for services authorized by BHRS Deputy Director of Adult Services or designee.
- 2) For provision of supported housing services, as described in Exhibit A Paragraph I.B.2. Contractor shall be paid a monthly amount of EIGHT HUNDRED TWENTY-EIGHT DOLLARS (\$828), not to exceed a total amount of NINE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED THIRTY-SIX DOLLARS (\$9,936).

c. Programmatic Support

For provision of administrative support services, as described in Exhibit A Paragraph I.B.3. Contractor shall be paid FIVE THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$5,000). Eleven monthly payments shall be made in the amount of FOUR HUNDRED SEVENTEEN DOLLARS (\$417). A final monthly payment shall be made in the amount of FOUR HUNDRED THIRTEEN DOLLARS (\$413).

d. Childcare Services

For childcare services as described in Paragraph I.B.4. of Exhibit A contractor shall be reimbursed at a rate of THIRTY-FIVE DOLLARS (\$35.00) per hour, up to a maximum of THREE THOUSAND FIVE HUNDRED DOLLARS (\$3,500). The minimum charge for these services shall be for two (2) hours or SEVENTY DOLLARS (\$70.00).

- B. In any event, the maximum amount County shall be obligated to pay for services rendered under this Agreement shall not exceed ONE HUNDRED SIXTY-EIGHT THOUSAND TWO HUNDRED TEN DOLLARS (\$168,210).
- C. Budget modifications may be approved by the Director of Health or designee, subject to the maximum amount set forth in Paragraph 3.

- D. The Director of Health is authorized to execute contract amendments which modify the County's maximum fiscal obligation by no more than \$25,000 (in aggregate) and/or modify the contract term and/or services so long as the modified term or services is/are within the current or revised fiscal provisions.
- E. Monthly Reporting
1. Payment by County to Contractor shall be monthly. Contractor shall bill County on or before the tenth (10<sup>th</sup>) working day of each month for the prior month. The invoice shall include a summary of services and changes for the month of service.
  2. Contractor shall provide back-up to the invoice. Such back-up shall be in the form of:
    - a. County provided service reporting form(s) ("Service Reporting Form(s)") completed by Contractor according to the instructions accompanying the Service Reporting Form(s), or
    - b. County approved form(s) which provide detailed description of services provided including but not limited to: client name, mental health ID#, service date, type of service provided, and duration of service.
  3. County reserves the right to change the Service Report Forms, instructions, and/or require the Contractor to modify their description of services as the County deems necessary.
- F. County anticipates the receipt of revenues from various sources to be used to fund services provided by Contractor through this Agreement. Should planned or actual revenues be less than the amounts anticipated at the time of the signing of this Agreement, the maximum payment obligation and/or payment obligations for specific services may be reduced at the discretion of the Director of Health or designee.
- G. In the event Contractor claims or receives payment from County for a service, reimbursement for which is later disallowed by County or the State of California or the United States Government, then Contractor shall promptly refund the disallowed amount to County upon request, or, at its option, County may offset the amount disallowed from any payment due or become due to Contractor under this Agreement or any other agreement.

- H. If County or Contractor finds that performance is inadequate, at the County's discretion, a meeting may be called to discuss the causes for the performance problem, and this Agreement may either be renegotiated, allowed to continue to end of term, or terminated pursuant to Paragraph 4 of this Agreement. Any unspent monies due to performance failure may reduce the following year's agreement, if any.
- I. In the event this Agreement is terminated prior to June 30, 2009, the Contractor shall be paid for services already provided pursuant to this Agreement.
- J. In the event Contractor claims or receives payment from County for a service, reimbursement for which is later disallowed by County or the State of California or the United States Government, then Contractor shall promptly refund the disallowed amount to County upon request, or, at its option, County may offset the amount disallowed from any payment due or become due to Contractor under this Agreement or any other agreement.
- K. Contractor shall submit to County a year-end cost report no later than ninety (90) days after the expiration date of this Agreement. This report shall be in accordance with the principles and format outlined in the Cost Reporting/Data Collection (CR/DC) Manual. Contractor shall annually have its books of accounts audited by a Certified Public Accountant and a copy of said audit report shall be submitted along with the Cost Report.
- L. Claims Certification and Program Integrity
