Description of Department of Public Works Permits Types of Approvals Inspections, Traffic and Transportation

Temporary Encroachment: Activity or object occurring or placed in the public right of way on a temporary basis, not requiring inspection. Examples include temporary placement of debris box or storage container, street closure for construction activity, etc.

Minor Encroachment: Simple work or construction occurring in the public right of way in accordance with County standards, anticipated to require up to two (2) inspections. Includes most encroachments associated with building permits where major roadway or utility construction is not required. Examples of minor encroachments include driveway construction, mailboxes, signs, etc.

Fence, Hedge or Wall in Public Right of Way: Fences, hedges or walls permitted for installation in the public right of way in accordance with Board Resolution No. 63037.

Major Encroachment: Work or construction occurring in the public right of way requiring extended impact to traffic, multiple inspections, or other ongoing disturbance. Examples include utility mainline replacement, major underground work, widening or reconfiguration of County road, etc. In addition to fees, a deposit is collected and charged for ongoing inspections, with the balance returned to the applicant upon completion.

Utility Maintenance: Annual permit issued to utility franchise holder (e.g. Pacific Gas & Electric Co., water districts, sewer districts, etc.) for maintenance of existing facilities in public right of way. Does not include mainline replacement (see Major Encroachment) or installation of service to new building (see Encroachment with Building Permit).

Additional Inspections: Third or subsequent inspection of encroachments or construction in non-maintained right of way beyond two inspections included in fee schedule for the categories above.

Special Event Road Closure: Closure of portion of public roadway as approved by law enforcement and fire agency for approved short-term activity or event such as block party.

Monitoring Wells: Placement of wells within the public right of way, typically for monitoring groundwater quality. In addition to permit and inspection fees, a deposit is collected as surety for the proper abandonment of wells when no longer needed.

Street Sign(s): New street name required for subdivisions and second dwelling units. Includes fabrication and installation of street sign.

Optional Parking Restrictions: New loading zone, time limited parking zone or no parking zone established at the request and for the benefit of an individual business or property owner, in accordance with County standards and California Vehicle Code provisions. Does not include Disabled Parking Zones which are implemented at no cost to the property owner.

Transportation Permit: Permits issued for hauling oversized loads on County-maintained roadways in accordance with State of California standards.
