WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, pursuant to Government Code Section 31000, County may contract with independent contractors for the furnishing of such services to or for County or any Department thereof;

WHEREAS, by Resolution 69659 the parties entered into an Agreement for the purpose of providing Congregate Nutrition Program, and Health Promotion/Disease Prevention Program services on September 9, 2008; and

WHEREAS, the parties wish to amend the Agreement to increase funding for the Congregate Nutrition Program by \$1,840 for a total of \$88,737:

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY AGREED BY THE PARTIES HERETO AS FOLLOWS:

1. Section 3 of the Agreement is amended to read as follows:

In consideration of the services provided by Contractor in accordance with all terms, conditions and specifications set forth herein and in Schedule A, County shall make payment to Contractor based on the rates and in the manner specified in Schedule B – Amendment One. The County reserves the right to withhold payment if the County determines that the quantity or quality of the work performed is unacceptable. In no event shall the County's total fiscal obligation under this Agreement exceed EIGHTY-EIGHT THOUSAND SEVEN HUNDRED THIRTY-SEVEN DOLLARS (\$88,737).

- 2. Schedule B of the Agreement is deleted and replaced and incorporated herein as Schedule B Amendment One as attached.
- 3. All other terms and conditions of the Agreement dated September 9, 2008, between the County and Contractor shall remain in full force and effect.

FY 2008-2009 FISCAL SUMMARY

Contractor shall operate the following Older Americans Act (OAA) and/or Community-Based Services (CBSP) program(s): a Congregate Nutrition Program and a Health Promotion/Disease Prevention Program. Services described in this Schedule B reflect program funding and payment methods during fiscal year July 1, 2008 through June 30, 2009. These programs shall operate in accordance with the California Department of Aging and/or state licensing regulations and the standards and requirements established by Aging and Adult Services of San Mateo County. Funds shall be used to subsidize the fees of seniors who are unable to pay the full cost of services.

I. CONGREGATE NUTRITION PROGRAM

Aging and Adult Services will pay Contractor in consideration of Congregate Nutrition Program services rendered through combined OAA and Nutrition Services Incentive Program (NSIP) funds, the rate of \$3.70 per meal.

AAS will pay the contractor a total of \$390 for supplies and equipment for the Congregate Nutrition Program.

AAS will also pay the contractor in One-Time-Only funds \$1,450 for the provision of three home- and community-based nutrition education projects at the Lincoln Park Senior Center.

The maximum reimbursement for the Congregate Nutrition Program during the contract term July 1, 2008 through June 30, 2009 shall not exceed SEVENTY-ONE THOUSAND SEVEN HUNDRED SEVENTY DOLLARS (\$71,770).

II. HEALTH PROMOTION/DISEASE PREVENTION PROGRAM

Aging and Adult Services will pay Contractor in consideration of Health Promotion/Disease prevention Program services rendered through OAA funds, the rate of one-twelfth of the total reimbursement for this program per month, as long as this amount does not exceed the total cost of Health Promotion/Disease Prevention Program services rendered.

The maximum reimbursement for the Health Promotion/Disease Prevention Program during the contract term July 1, 2008 through June 30, 2009 shall not exceed FIVE THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$5,000).

Contractor agrees to the following:

- A. Contractor is responsible for covering the cost of all components of each program outlined above and shall be reimbursed for actual expenditures on the approved budget for each program;
- A mid-year review, scheduled for January, will require a reconciliation of year-to-date outcomes. Based on these outcomes, a budget revision may be required;
- C. Submit client intake forms as appropriate, monthly program reports, and invoices by the tenth (10th) of each month. (Invoices submitted more than two months past the month of service may not be reimbursed. Statistical reports submitted more than one month past the month of service may result in withholding of payments until reports are brought current.);
- D. Offer services throughout the twelve-month contract period, unless prior written approval is received from Aging and Adult Services;
- E. Submit a closing report with supporting documentation of expenses by July 31, 2009;

Documentation should include the following:

- General ledger of expenditures for the contracted program
- Applicable payroll register
- Lease agreements and allocation percentage for rent cost
- Equipment invoices
- Vendor invoices for large purchases
- CDA 32 form Report of property furnished/purchased
- F. Program Income must be reported and expended under the same terms and conditions as the program funds from which it is generated; and
- G. Program Income must be used to pay for current allowable costs of the program in the same fiscal year that the income was earned.

The maximum reimbursement for contracted services between San Mateo County Aging and Adult Services and the City of Daly City is \$76,770 in OAA and NSIP funds, and \$11,967 in County General Funds for general program support for a total amount of EIGHTY-EIGHT THOUSAND SEVEN HUNDRED THIRTY-SEVEN DOLLARS (\$88,737) for the contract term July 1, 2008 through June 30, 2009.
