AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE COUNTY OF SAN MATEO AND CHIODO ART DEVELOPMENT

THIS AGREEMENT, entered into this _____ day of May, 2009, by and between the COUNTY OF SAN MATEO, hereinafter called "County," and CHIODO ART DEVELOPMENT, hereinafter called "Contractor;"

WITNESSEIH:

WHEREAS, pursuant to Government Code, Section 31000, County may contract with independent contractors for the furnishing of such services to or for County or any Department thereof;

WHEREAS, it is necessary and desirable that Contractor be retained for the purpose of the fabrication, delivery and installation of an artistic outdoor educational exhibit.

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY AGREED BY THE PARTIES HERETO AS FOLLOWS:

1. Exhibits and Attachments

The following exhibits and attachments are included hereto and incorporated by reference herein:

Exhibit A-Scope of Services: Description of Services to be Performed

Exhibit B—Scope of Services: Amount and Method of Payment

Attachment I—\$504 Compliance

Attachment IP—Intellectual Property

2. Services to be performed by Contractor

In consideration of the payments set forth herein and in Exhibit "B", Contractor shall perform services for County in accordance with the terms, conditions and specifications set forth herein and in Exhibit "A."

3. Payments

In consideration of the services provided by Contractor in accordance with all terms, conditions and specifications set forth herein and in Exhibit "A," County shall make payment to Contractor based on the rates and in the manner specified in Exhibit "B." The County reserves the right to withhold payment if the County determines that the quantity or quality of the work performed is unacceptable. In no event shall the County's total fiscal obligation under this Agreement exceed four hundred twenty nine thousand three hundred fourteen dollars (\$429,314).

4. Term and Termination

Subject to compliance with all terms and conditions, the term of this Agreement shall be from May 19, 2009 through May 30, 2010.

This Agreement may be terminated by the Director of San Mateo County Parks Department, or his designee at any time without a requirement of good cause upon thirty (30) days' written notice to the Contractor.

In the event of termination, all finished or unfinished documents, data, studies, maps, photographs, reports, and materials (hereafter referred to as materials) prepared by Contractor under this Agreement shall become the property of the County and shall be promptly delivered to the County. Upon termination, the Contractor may make and retain a copy of such materials. Subject to availability of funding, Contractor shall be entitled to receive payment for work/services provided prior to termination of the Agreement. Such payment shall be that portion of the full payment which is determined by comparing the work/services completed to the work/services required by the Agreement.

Contractor agrees that the requirements of this Agreement pertaining to the protection of proprietary rights, confidentiality, hold harmless/indemnification shall survive termination of this Agreement.

5. Availability of Funds

The County may terminate this Agreement or a portion of the services referenced in the Attachments and Exhibit "A" based upon unavailability of Federal, State, or County funds, by providing written notice to Contractor as soon as is reasonably possible after the County learns of said unavailability of outside funding.

6. Relationship of Parties

Contractor agrees and understands that the work/services performed under this Agreement are performed as an independent Contractor and not as an employee of the County and that Contractor acquires none of the rights, privileges, powers, or advantages of County employees.

7. Hold Harmiess

Contractor shall indemnify and save harmless County, its officers, agents, employees, and servants from all claims, suits, or actions of every name, kind, and description, brought for, or on account of: (A) injuries to or death of any person, including Contractor, or (B) damage to any property of any kind whatsoever and to whomsoever belonging, (C) any sanctions, penalties, or claims of damages resulting from Contractor's failure to comply with the requirements set forth in the Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act of 1996 (HIPAA) and all Federal regulations promulgated thereunder, as amended, or (D) any other loss or cost, including but not limited to that caused by the concurrent active or passive

negligence of County, its officers, agents, employees, or servants, resulting from the performance of any work required of Contractor or payments made pursuant to this Agreement, provided that this shall not apply to injuries or damage for which County has been found in a court of competent jurisdiction to be solely liable by reason of its own negligence or willful misconduct.

The duty of Contractor to indemnify and save harmless as set forth herein, shall include the duty to defend as set forth in Section 2778 of the California Civil Code.

8. Assignability and Subcontracting

Contractor shall not assign this Agreement or any portion thereof to a third party or subcontract with a third party to provide services required by contractor under this Agreement without the prior written consent of County. Any such assignment or subcontract without the County's prior written consent shall give County the right to automatically and immediately terminate this Agreement.

9. <u>Insurance</u>

The Contractor shall not commence work or be required to commence work under this Agreement unless and until all insurance required under this paragraph has been obtained and such insurance has been approved by Risk Management, and Contractor shall use diligence to obtain such insurance and to obtain such approval. The Contractor shall furnish the County with certificates of insurance evidencing the required coverage, and there shall be a specific contractual liability endorsement extending the Contractor's coverage to include the contractual liability assumed by the Contractor pursuant to this Agreement. These certificates shall specify or be endorsed to provide that thirty (30) days' notice must be given, in writing, to the County of any pending change in the limits of liability or of any cancellation or modification of the policy.

- (1) Worker's Compensation and Employer's Liability Insurance The Contractor shall have in effect during the entire life of this Agreement Workers' Compensation and Employer's Liability Insurance providing full statutory coverage. In signing this Agreement, the Contractor certifies, as required by Section 1861 of the California Labor Code, that it is aware of the provisions of Section 3700 of the California Labor Code which requires every employer to be insured against liability for Worker's Compensation or to undertake self-insurance in accordance with the provisions of the Code, and will comply with such provisions before commencing the performance of the work of this Agreement.
- (2) <u>Liability Insurance</u> The Contractor shall take out and maintain during the life of this Agreement such Bodily Injury Liability and Property Damage Liability Insurance as shall protect him/her while performing work covered by this Agreement from any and all claims for damages for bodily injury, including accidental death, as well as any and all claims for property damage which may arise from contractors operations under this Agreement, whether such

operations be by himself/herself or by any sub-contractor or by anyone directly or indirectly employed by either of them. Such insurance shall be combined single limit bodily injury and property damage for each occurrence and shall be not less than the amount specified below.

Such insurance shall include:

(a) Comprehensive General Liability \$1,000,000

Motor Vehicle Liability Insurance will be obtained through a vehicle rental vendor.

Professional Liability Insurance is waived. Sculpture design has been certified by a registered civil engineer.

County and its officers, agents, employees and servants shall be named as additional insured on any such policies of insurance, which shall also contain a provision that the insurance afforded thereby to the County, its officers, agents, employees and servants shall be primary insurance to the full limits of liability of the policy, and that if the County or its officers and employees have other insurance against the loss covered by such a policy, such other insurance shall be excess insurance only.

In the event of the breach of any provision of this section, or in the event any notice is received which indicates any required insurance coverage will be diminished or canceled, the County of San Mateo at its option, may, notwithstanding any other provision of this Agreement to the contrary, immediately declare a material breach of this Agreement and suspend all further work pursuant to this Agreement.

10. Compliance with laws; payment of Permits/Licenses

All services to be performed by Contractor pursuant to this Agreement shall be performed in accordance with all applicable Federal, State, County, and municipal laws, including, but not limited to, Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act of 1996 (HIPAA) and all Federal regulations promulgated thereunder, as amended, and the Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990, as amended, and Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973, as amended and attached hereto and incorporated by reference herein as Attachment "I," which prohibits discrimination on the basis of handicap in programs and activities receiving any Federal or County financial assistance. Such services shall also be performed in accordance with all applicable ordinances and regulations, including, but not limited to, appropriate licensure, certification regulations, provisions pertaining to confidentiality of records, and applicable quality assurance regulations. Further, Contractor certifies that the Contractor and all of its subcontractors will adhere to all applicable provisions of Chapter 4.106 of the San Mateo County Ordinance Code, which regulates the use of disposable food service ware.

In the event of a conflict between the terms of this agreement and State, Federal, County, or municipal law or regulations, the requirements of the applicable law will

take precedence over the requirements set forth in this Agreement.

Contractor will timely and accurately complete, sign, and submit all necessary documentation of compliance.

11. Non-Discrimination and Other Requirements

- A. Section 504 applies only to Contractor who are providing services to members of the public. Contractor shall comply with § 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973, which provides that no otherwise qualified handicapped individual shall, solely by reason of a disability, be excluded from the participation in, be denied the benefits of, or be subjected to discrimination in the performance of this Agreement.
- B. General non-discrimination. No person shall, on the grounds of race, color, religion, ancestry, gender, age (over 40), national origin, medical condition (cancer), physical or mental disability, sexual orientation, pregnancy, childbirth or related medical condition, marital status, or political affiliation be denied any benefits or subject to discrimination under this Agreement.
- C. Equal employment opportunity. Contractor shall ensure equal employment opportunity based on objective standards of recruitment, classification, selection, promotion, compensation, performance evaluation, and management relations for all employees under this Agreement. Contractor's equal employment policies shall be made available to County of San Mateo upon request.
- D. Violation of Non-discrimination provisions. Violation of the non-discrimination provisions of this Agreement shall be considered a breach of this Agreement and subject the Contractor to penalties, to be determined by the County Manager, including but not limited to
 - i) termination of this Agreement;
 - ii) disqualification of the Contractor from bidding on or being awarded a County contract for a period of up to 3 years;
 - iii) liquidated damages of \$2,500 per violation:
 - iv) imposition of other appropriate contractual and civil remedies and sanctions, as determined by the County Manager.

To effectuate the provisions of this section, the County Manager shall have the authority to examine Contractor's employment records with respect to compliance with this paragraph and/or to set off all or any portion of the amount described in this paragraph against amounts due to Contractor under the Contract or any other Contract between Contractor and County.

Contractor shall report to the County Manager the filing by any person in any court of any complaint of discrimination or the filing by any person of any and all charges with the Equal Employment Opportunity Commission, the Fair Employment and Housing Commission or any other entity charged with the investigation of allegations within 30 days of such filing, provided that within such 30 days such entity has not notified Contractor that such charges are dismissed or otherwise unfounded. Such

notification shall include the name of the complainant, a copy of such complaint, and a description of the circumstance. Contractor shall provide County with a copy of their response to the Complaint when filed.

- E. Compliance with Equal Benefits Ordinance. With respect to the provision of employee benefits, Contractor shall comply with the County Ordinance which prohibits contractors from discriminating in the provision of employee benefits between an employee with a domestic partner and an employee with a spouse.
- F. The Contractor shall comply fully with the non-discrimination requirements required by 41 CFR 60-741.5 (a), which is incorporated herein as if fully, set forth.

12. Compliance with Contractor Employee Jury Service Ordinance

Contractor shall comply with the County Ordinance with respect to provision of jury duty pay to employees and have and adhere to a written policy that provides that its employees shall receive from the Contractor, on an annual basis, no less than five days of regular pay for actual jury service in San Mateo County. The policy may provide that employees deposit any fees received for such jury service with the Contractor or that the Contractor deduct from the employees' regular pay the fees received for jury service.

13. Retention of Records, Right to Monitor and Audit

- (a) CONTRACTOR shall maintain all required records for three (3) years after the COUNTY makes final payment and all other pending matters are closed, and shall be subject to the examination and/or audit of the County, a Federal grantor agency, and the State of California.
- (b) Reporting and Record Keeping: CONTRACTOR shall comply with all program and fiscal reporting requirements set forth by appropriate Federal, State and local agencies, and as required by the COUNTY.
- (c) CONTRACTOR agrees to provide to COUNTY, to any Federal or State department having monitoring or review authority, to COUNTY's authorized representatives, and/or their appropriate audit agencies upon reasonable notice, access to and the right to examine all records and documents necessary to determine compliance with relevant Federal, State, and local statutes, rules and regulations, and this Agreement, and to evaluate the quality, appropriateness and timeliness of services performed.

14. Merger Clause

This Agreement, including the Exhibits attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference, constitutes the sole Agreement of the parties hereto and correctly states the rights, duties, and obligations of each party as of this document's date. In the event that any term, condition, provision, requirement or specification set forth in this body of the agreement conflicts with or is inconsistent with any term, condition, agreement, promises, negotiations, or representations between the parties not expressly stated in this document are not binding. All subsequent modifications shall be in writing and signed by the parties.

15. Controlling Law and Venue

The validity of this Agreement and of its terms or provisions, as well as the rights and duties of the parties hereunder, the interpretation, and performance of this Agreement shall be governed by the laws of the State of California. Any dispute arising out of this Agreement shall be venued either in the San Mateo County Superior Court or the United States District Court for the Northern District of California.

16. Notices

Any notice, request, demand, or other communication required or permitted hereunder shall be deemed to be properly given when both (1) transmitted via facsimile to the telephone number listed below and (2) either deposited in the United Sates mail, postage prepaid, or when deposited for overnight delivery with an established overnight courier that provides a tracking number showing confirmation of receipt for transmittal, charges prepaid, addressed to:

Scope of Services

I. <u>Description of Services to be Performed by the Contractor, Chiodo Art Development</u>

Contractor will work with and provide information to an engineering consultant separately hired and paid for by the County for the design of a concrete base for the artistic outdoor educational exhibit at the Fitzgerald Marine Reserve. Information to be provided will include exhibit size, weight, connection locations, connection details, fall zones, and any other pertinent information needed for the base design.

Contractor will work with and provide on-site consulting for a construction contractor separately hired and paid for by the County for the installation of a concrete base with curbing and rubberized surfacing. Consulting will include fastener location, exhibit protection, and installation coordination.

Contractor will attend, as needed, a community meeting in late Spring (May/June 2009) and a Coastal Commission meeting to support the community and permit processes.

Contractor will construct and install a full size exhibit of tidepool animals at Fitzgerald Marine Reserve based on the previously approved Final Fitzgerald Intrepretative Exhibit – Plan View submitted March 6, 2009 and on the conceptual design model submitted to, and approved by, the San Mateo Parks Commission on December 4, 2008. Each animal and plant depicted on the Fitzgerald Intrepretative Exhibit plan and model will be re-created full size in concrete. Most of the elements will be sculpted, molded, and cast at Chiodo Art Development; some will be sculpted on-site utilizing hand sculpted urethane stamps. The steel armature supporting the concrete elements will be manufactured at Chiodo Art Development, brought to the site, and permanently mounted to the foundation. Each independent animal or plant sculpture will be permanantly attached to the steel structure, then the final sculpted animals and plants will be added along with the rockwork. All of the concrete exhibit will receive surface stains and UV/anti-graffiti sealant.

The project will be completed in two phases:

Phase 1: Enlarge exhibit animals to full size, mold and cast, consult with base designer and construction contractor — approximate timeframe 6 months (June 1, 2009 through November 30, 2009).

Phase 2: Deliver, install final sculpture, stain and seal – approximate timeframe 6 weeks (March 15, 2010 through May 30, 2010 weather permitting)

No changes in the exhibit from the approved design and model will be made except upon written approval from the County to the Contractor. This includes size, contents, colors, and orientation. Any changes to the approved design by the County may result in additional fees.

Contractor will coordinate on-site work with County Park staff to minimize impact to the neighborhood and visitors. All work shall occur Monday through Friday between 9:00 a.m. and 6:00 p.m. unless specifically approved by the County.

County shall obtain all permits for the project. County will make the Contractor aware of any permit or site requirements and Contractor shall follow such requirements pertaining to Contractor's work.

Contractor shall be responsible for site security, construction related signage, and site safety during Phase II and shall coordinate this with construction contractor. County will not be responsible for security of the site or Contractor's equipment or materials.

County will provide and pay for any testing and inspections.

Contractor will coordinate with the County to establish a staging area near the site for storage, work, and fabrication. Contractor will remove all of their materials, debris, and other items upon completion of work returning any used area to its original condition.

County will provide one 110 Volt 15 amp electrical connection for Contractor's use without charge.

Any non-construction related signage and graphics will be provided by the County.

II.Work For Hire and Waiver of Rights

This work is being made as a work for hire, and all intellectual property rights in the created work belongs solely to the County. In addition, Contractor specifically waives any other rights it may have in the work for hire, including but not limited to moral rights, author rights and rights of attribution, for all works created under this agreement. This waiver specifically includes but is in no way limited to any rights under the California Art Preservation Act (California Civil Code section 987, et seq.) and state or federal copyright laws including but in no way limited to Title 17, Chapter 1 of the United States Code. This section II waiver and Attachment IP shall survive termination of this Agreement.

The County retains the right to move the Fitzgerald Interpretive Exhibit artwork, demolish it, or change it after Contractor has completed it. The unique combination of elements - the design of the Interpretive Exhibit in totality - is owned by the County and will not be re-created for another client by the Contractor.

Contractor retains the right of reasonable re-use of the molds for the cast elements of the Interpretive Exhibit, and may reproduce elements from the Project to be used in different combinations or as single items. Contractor is also permitted to post photos of the model and full size Interpretive Exhibit in its marketing materials.

Scope of Services

I. Amount and Method of Payment

County will pay Contractor within 30 days of receipt of invoice and upon acceptance of work or products being invoiced.

Contractor will invoice and County will pay upon acceptance of work as follows:

Phase Ia – Mobilization and initial setup to enlarge model to full scale including steel frame and concrete stamps, consultation with base structure design consultant (estimated date: June 1, 2009) \$128,794.20 (30% of total contract amount)

Phase Ib – Midpoint of enlarging process, consultation with construction contractor (estimated date: September 1, 2009) \$128,794.20 (30% of total contract amount)

Phase IIa – Delivery and start of installation (estimated date: March 15, 2010) \$85,862.80 (20% of total contract amount)

Phase IIb – Final sculpting, stains, sealant, demobilization (estimated date: May 30, 2010) \$85,862.80 (20% of total contract amount)

Total amount paid under this contract shall not exceed \$429,314.00.

Attachment IP - Intellectual Property Rights

- The County of San Mateo ("County"), shall and does own all titles, rights and interests in all Work Products created by Contractor and its subcontractors (collectively "Vendors") for the County under this Agreement. Contractor may not sell, transfer, or permit the use of any Work Products without the express written consent of the County.
- 2. "Work Products" are defined as all materials, tangible or not, created in whatever medium pursuant to this Agreement, including without limitation publications, promotional or educational materials, reports, manuals, specifications, drawings and sketches, computer programs, software and databases, schematics, marks, logos, graphic designs, notes, matters and combinations thereof, and all forms of intellectual property.
- 3. Contractor shall not dispute or contest, directly or indirectly, the County's exclusive right and title to the Work Products nor the validity of the intellectual property embodied therein. Contractor hereby assigns, and if later required by the County, shall assign to the County all titles, rights and interests in all Work Products. Contractor shall cooperate and cause subcontractors to cooperate in perfecting County's titles, rights or interests in any Work Product, including prompt execution of documents as presented by the County.
- 4. To the extent any of the Work Products may be protected by U.S. Copyright laws, Parties agree that the County commissions Vendors to create the copyrightable Work Products, which are intended to be work-made-for-hire for the sole benefit of the County and the copyright of which is vested in the County.
- 5. In the event that the title, rights, and/or interests in any Work Products are deemed not to be "work-made-for-hire" or not owned by the County, Contractor hereby assigns and shall require all persons performing work pursuant to this Agreement, including its subcontractors, to assign to the County all titles, rights, interests, and/or copyrights in such Work Product. Should such assignment and/or transfer become necessary or if at any time the County requests cooperation of Contractor to perfect the County's titles, rights or interests in any Work Product, Contractor agrees to promptly execute and to obtain execution of any documents (including assignments) required to perfect the titles, rights, and interests of the County in the Work Products with no additional charges to the County beyond that identified in this Agreement or subsequent change orders. The County, however, shall pay all filing fees required for the assignment, transfer, recording, and/or application.
- 6. Contractor agrees that before commencement of any subcontract work it will incorporate this <u>Schedule I</u> to contractually bind or otherwise oblige its subcontractors and personnel performing work under this Agreement such that the County's titles, rights, and interests in Work Products are preserved and protected as intended herein.
