Descriptions of Proposed Traffic Control Devices by Location: Item Location

#1 3rd Ave. at Fair Oaks Ave.

Add two Stop Signs to direct drivers on 3rd Ave. to stop and yield to traffic on Fair Oaks Ave. Residents requested that we study this intersection for stop signs. It qualified because:

- MUTCD Section 2B.05 "Warrant A" is met: Intersection of a less important road (3rd Ave. ADT: 415) with a main road (Fair Oaks Ave. ADT: 1,988) where application of the normal right-of-way rule would not be expected to provide reasonable compliance with the law
- MUTCD Section 2B.05 "Warrant D" is met: High speeds, restricted view, or crash records indicate a need for stop sign controls. This is supported by:
 - A. 85th Percentile Speeds on Fair Oaks Ave.: 27 mph, which is greater than the prima facie speed limit of 25 mph
 - B. Views can be restricted by parked cars
 - C. 3 Reported Collisions at this intersection since 2005.



Descriptions of Proposed Traffic Control Devices by Location: Item Location

#2 Palma Ave. at Ave. Cabrillo

Two Yield Signs to direct drivers on Palma Ave. to yield to traffic on Ave. Cabrillo. Residents requested that we study this intersection for stop or yield signs. It qualified for yield signs because:

- MUTCD Section 2B.09 Yield Sign "Warrant A" is met: When the ability to see all potentially conflicting traffic is insufficient to allow a road user traveling at the posted speed, the 85th-percentile speed, or the statutory speed to pass through the intersection or to stop in a reasonably safe manner.
- MUTCD Section 2B.09 Yield Sign "Warrant D" is met: An intersection where a special problem exists and where engineering judgment indicates the problem to be susceptible to correction by the use of the YIELD sign. Special problem: A minor road (Palma St. ADT: 133 south of Cabrillo; 80 north of Cabrillo) intersects with a major road with a wide planted median strip (Ave. Cabrillo ADT: 247) where the application of the normal right-of-way rule would not be expected to provide reasonable compliance with the law. Staff has observed that during school drop off and pick up times the motorists traveling on Palma St. proceed through the Cabrillo right of way without yielding to traffic on Cabrillo.



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
