



Since FY 2008 the Department of Housing has reduced operating costs in HCD division by \$900,000 including the elimination of 3 positions

- FY 2008-09: Eliminate 1 Housing Specialist
 - Reduced car fleet, printers
- FY 2009-10: Eliminate 1 Accountant
 - Eliminate 1 Management Analyst
 - Reduction of 40% to Strategic Initiative
 - Moved some Strategic Initiatives staffing to Housing Authority

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Planning and Priority-Setting Process

- Quarterly meetings with all staff to source new ideas
- Ad hoc cost-control committees
- Criteria Used to Develop Budget Reductions
 - Keep core services intact; no programs eliminated
 - Leverage through partners, especially Housing Authority



Discretionary Services

- Funding for Affordable & Supportive Housing
- Homebuyer Assistance Loans
- Housing Rehabilitation Loans & Grant
- Community Development Loans
- Countywide Housing Initiatives:
 - HEART, HOPE, 21 Elements, Grand Boulevard, North Fair Oaks Community Plan, Health & Build Environment, Policy Primers, Info & Referral

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Proposed Reductions TOTAL = \$400,000

- Proposed Reduction Adjustments
 - Cut 2 Housing Specialist positions
 - Cut 1 Housing Program Supervisor position
 - Reduced Strategic Initiatives budget by \$50,000
- Implementation July 1, 2010
- Impact
 - No impact on direct services; we work though partners
 - Slower, narrower, thinner participation / leadership in multiple countywide housing collaboratives
 - Reduced no-charge technical assistance to Planning Department and Health Department



Looking AheadFY 2011-2012 and FY 2012-2013

- No reduction of core service scope, just pace
- Will distribute work on Strategic Initiatives more broadly, especially to Housing Authority staff
- Would need \$100,000 of General Fund to continue Strategic Initiatives full-scope, due to insufficient federal funding for program administration
- No direct exposure to further State budget cuts

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
