Scope of Work:

The San Mateo Medical Center (SMMC) contract will allow the Vivamos Activos Project (RO1- HL 089 448; SPO#38148) to fulfill its scope of work. The contract includes the payment of SMMC personnel to perform work on the Vivamos Activos Project and to collaborate on the development and dissemination of the project intervention. The specific functions of SMMC personnel and the locations of facilities are described in the budget justification below. The detailed budget for the contract is located in a separate Excel file.
