SUBJECT:

Agreement with Blue Water Design to prepare Designs

Plans and Specifications and Secure Permits for the

Replacement of Dock 29 at the Coyote Point Marina.

RECOMMENDATION:

Adopt a Resolution authorizing the:

- 1. President of the Board to execute an agreement with Blue Water Design Group to prepare Designs Plans and Specifications and secure permits for the replacement of Dock 29 at the Coyote Point Marina for the term September 14, 2010 through October 31, 2011, In an amount not to exceed \$109,929, there is no Net County Cost; and
- 2. Director of the Department of Parks or the Director's designee to execute contract amendments which modify the County's maximum fiscal obligation by no more than \$25,000 (in aggregate), and/or modify the contract term and/or services so long as the modified term or services is/are within the current or revised fiscal provisions.

BACKGROUND:

Coyote Point Marina, which is owned and operated by the County of San Mateo, lies approximately 15 miles south of downtown San Francisco on the San Francisco Bay. The Marina is managed as an Enterprise Fund under the San Mateo County Parks Department. The Marina currently has 545 berths, a Harbormaster's Office, Yacht Club, fuel dock, a three-lane boat ramp, and a pump out facility. The Marina also has restrooms, and designated recreational areas for public use.

Dock 29 is a concrete dock, which is designed to handle the largest boats (to 50') in the Marina. Because of its location at the most windward side of the Marina adjacent to the main entrance channel, it is subject to storm

winds and significant wave action. Because Dock 29 has suffered damage some of the fingers of the dock have been removed and currently no boats are berthed there. Dock 29 was installed in 1976 / 1977 as part of Basin II Improvements. We want to replace the existing 11,236 square foot pier supported multiple boat dock with a similar dock at the same approximate location that is better able to stand up to weather, wave, and tide conditions than the existing dock.

DISCUSSION:

The first steps will be an evaluation of alternative designs, and definition of a preferred alternative including cost estimates. Based on the final selection of a preferred alternative, the contractor will prepare Design Plans, Specifications, Engineers Cost Estimates and biddable documents to County Public Works requirements, and if necessary assist in securing any necessary permits from regulatory agencies. A new California Department of Boating and Waterways loan has been secured to construct the new Dock 29.

The term of the Agreement is from September 14, 2010 through October 31, 2011. The agreement and Resolution have been reviewed and approved by County Counsel. The contractor has assured compliance with the County's Contractor Employee Jury Service Ordinance, as well as other contract provisions that are required by county ordinance and administrative memoranda, including, but not limited to insurance, hold harmless, non-discrimination and equal benefits. County Counsel has reviewed and approved the Resolution and Agreement as to form

Approval of this Resolution and Agreement contributes to the Shared Vision 2025 outcome of an Environmentally Conscious Community by ensuring the goal to maintain and expand recreational opportunities on County Park lands is met. Replacement of Dock 29 will ensure large boats will be able to continue to be berthed at the Coyote Point Marina, which helps fund its operation and maintenance as an Enterprise Fund.

FISCAL IMPACT:

The project is being funded by a California Department of Boating and Waterways loan. The proposed cost of the agreement is in an amount not to exceed \$109,929, and if the optional tasks were included it would not exceed \$122,265. When rebuilt and occupied Dock 29 could be expected to generate over \$100,000 per year in revenue annually at No Net County Cost.
