RECOMMENDATION:

Adopt a Resolution authorizing the:

- A) President of the Board to execute an Agreement with Ligaya Bruce-Badilla doing business as Bruce-Badilla Board and Care Home for the provision of residential board and care services for the term July 1, 2011 through June 30, 2014, for a maximum obligation of \$259,535; and
- B) Chief of the Health System or designee to execute contract amendments which modify the County's maximum fiscal obligation by no more than \$25,000 (in aggregate), and/or modify the contract term and/or services so long as the modified term or services is/are within the current or revised fiscal provisions.

BACKGROUND:

Since December 1985 your Board has approved resolutions authorizing expenditures for residential care facilities serving mentally ill clients. Behavioral Health and Recovery Services (BHRS) has contracted with this provider since 1998 for the provision of specialized residential care for dually-diagnosed adult clients. Under the B-1 Administrative Memorandum the selection of providers of residential services for mental health clients is exempt from the Request for Proposals requirement. BHRS publishes a public notice every year to solicit applications for new providers.

DISCUSSION:

This contractor operates a 12-bed board and care facility, which provides supervised housing, treatment and rehabilitation services to assist male clients with a co-occurring diagnosis to manage and recover from mental illness and substance abuse symptoms. The services enable these men to be treated in the community, thus avoiding more costly acute and sub-acute psychiatric hospitalization.

The Agreement and Resolution have been reviewed and approved by County Counsel. The Contractor's insurance has been reviewed and approved by Risk Management.

Because the provider is so small, it would be a financial hardship to comply with the County Equal Benefits Ordinance and the Employee Jury Service Ordinance. The County Manager's Office has reviewed and approved a waiver excluding both of these requirements. This Agreement is on the Continuing Resolution.

The Agreement contributes to the Shared Vision 2025 outcome of a Healthy Community by providing residential board and care services to mentally ill clients. BHRS provides a range of services to promote wellness and recovery and to support consumers remaining in the lowest possible level of care. The provision of residential board and care services is one established level of care. The services provided contribute to this measure. It is anticipated that 91% of clients who receive services shall rate services as good or better.

FISCAL IMPACT:

The term of this Agreement is July 1, 2011 through June 30, 2014. The Agreement maximum is \$259,535 for the three-year term. The budgeted maximum for FY 2011-12 is \$86,535. Of that amount, sales tax through Realignment will fund \$72,580, Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration Block Grant will fund \$4,985, and the remaining \$8,970 represents Net County Cost. Funds for these services are included in the BHRS FY 2011-12 Recommended Budget. Similar arrangements will be in place for FY 2012-13 and FY 2013-14.

WHEREAS, there has been presented to this Board of Supervisors for its consideration and acceptance an Agreement, reference to which is hereby made for further particulars, whereby Ligaya Bruce-Badilla doing business as Bruce-Badilla Board and Care Home, shall provide residential board and care services for mentally ill clients for the term July 1, 2011 through June 30, 2014, for a total obligation of \$259,535; and

WHEREAS, this Board has approved the Agreement as to both form and content and desires to enter into the Agreement.

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY DETERMINED AND ORDERED that the

President of this Board of Supervisors be and is hereby authorized and directed to

execute said Agreement for and on behalf of the County of San Mateo, and the Clerk of

this Board shall attest the President's signature thereto.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Chief of the Health System or be and is hereby authorized to execute contract amendments which modify the County's maximum fiscal obligation by no more than \$25,000 (in aggregate), and/or modify the contract term and/or services so long as the modified term or services is/are within the current or revised fiscal provisions.

AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE COUNTY OF SAN MATEO AND LIGAYA BRUCE-BADILLA DOING BUSINESS AS BRUCE-BADILLA BOARD AND CARE HOME

THIS AGREEMENT, entered into this day of,
20, by and between the COUNTY OF SAN MATEO, hereinafter called
"County," and LIGAYA BRUCE-BADILLA DOING BUSINESS AS BRUCE-BADILLA
BOARD AND CARE HOME, hereinafter called "Contractor";

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, pursuant to Government Code, Section 31000, County may contract with independent contractors for the furnishing of such services to or for County or any Department thereof;

WHEREAS, it is necessary and desirable that Contractor be retained for the purpose of professional services.

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY AGREED BY THE PARTIES HERETO AS FOLLOWS:

1. Exhibits and Attachments

The following exhibits and attachments are included hereto and incorporated by reference herein:

Exhibit A—Services

Exhibit B—Payments and rates

Attachment I—§ 504 Compliance

2. Services to be performed by Contractor

In consideration of the payments set forth herein and in Exhibit "B," Contractor shall perform services for County in accordance with the terms, conditions and specifications set forth herein and in Exhibit "A."

3. Payments

In consideration of the services provided by Contractor in accordance with all terms, conditions and specifications set forth herein and in Exhibit "A," County shall make payment to Contractor based on the rates and in the manner specified in Exhibit "B." The County reserves the right to withhold payment if the County determines that the quantity or quality of the work performed is unacceptable. In no event shall the County's total fiscal obligation under this Agreement exceed TWO HUNDRED FIFTY-NINE THOUSAND FIVE HUNDRED THIRTY-FIVE DOLLARS (\$259,535).

4. Term and Termination

Subject to compliance with all terms and conditions, the term of this Agreement shall be from July 1, 2011 through June 30, 2014.

This Agreement may be terminated by Contractor, the Chief of the Health System or designee at any time without a requirement of good cause upon thirty (30) days' written notice to the other party.

In the event of termination, all finished or unfinished documents, data, studies, maps, photographs, reports, and materials (hereafter referred to as materials) prepared by Contractor under this Agreement shall become the property of the County and shall be promptly delivered to the County. Upon termination, the Contractor may make and retain a copy of such materials. Subject to availability of funding, Contractor shall be entitled to receive payment for work/services provided prior to termination of the Agreement. Such payment shall be that portion of the full payment which is determined by comparing the work/services completed to the work/services required by the Agreement.

5. Availability of Funds

The County may terminate this Agreement or a portion of the services referenced in the Attachments and Exhibits based upon unavailability of Federal, State, or County funds, by providing written notice to Contractor as soon as is reasonably possible after the County learns of said unavailability of outside funding.

6. Relationship of Parties

Contractor agrees and understands that the work/services performed under this Agreement are performed as an independent Contractor and not as an employee of the County and that Contractor acquires none of the rights, privileges, powers, or advantages of County employees.

7. Hold Harmless

Contractor shall indemnify and save harmless County, its officers, agents, employees, and servants from all claims, suits, or actions of every name, kind, and description, brought for, or on account of: (A) injuries to or death of any person, including Contractor, or (B) damage to any property of any kind whatsoever and to whomsoever belonging, (C) any sanctions, penalties, or claims of damages resulting from Contractor's failure to comply with the requirements set forth in the Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act of 1996 (HIPAA) and all Federal regulations promulgated thereunder, as amended, or (D) any other loss or cost, including but not limited to that caused by the concurrent active or passive negligence of County, its officers, agents, employees, or servants, resulting from the performance of any work required of Contractor or payments made pursuant to this Agreement, provided that this shall not apply to injuries or damage for which County has been found in a court of competent jurisdiction to be solely liable by reason of its own negligence or willful misconduct.

The duty of Contractor to indemnify and save harmless as set forth herein, shall include the duty to defend as set forth in Section 2778 of the California Civil Code.

8. Assignability and Subcontracting

Contractor shall not assign this Agreement or any portion thereof to a third party or subcontract with a third party to provide services required by contractor under this Agreement without the prior written consent of County. Any such assignment or subcontract without the County's prior written consent shall give County the right to automatically and immediately terminate this Agreement.

9. Insurance

The Contractor shall not commence work or be required to commence work under this Agreement unless and until all insurance required under this paragraph has been obtained and such insurance has been approved by Risk Management, and Contractor shall use diligence to obtain such insurance and to obtain such approval. The Contractor shall furnish the Department/Division with certificates of insurance evidencing the required coverage, and there shall be a specific contractual liability endorsement extending the Contractor's coverage to include the contractual liability assumed by the Contractor pursuant to this Agreement. These certificates shall specify or be endorsed to provide that thirty (30) days' notice must be given, in writing, to the Department/Division of any pending change in the limits of liability or of any cancellation or modification of the policy.

- (1) Worker's Compensation and Employer's Liability Insurance The Contractor shall have in effect during the entire life of this Agreement Workers' Compensation and Employer's Liability Insurance providing full statutory coverage. In signing this Agreement, the Contractor certifies, as required by Section 1861 of the California Labor Code, that it is aware of the provisions of Section 3700 of the California Labor Code which requires every employer to be insured against liability for Worker's Compensation or to undertake self-insurance in accordance with the provisions of the Code, and I will comply with such provisions before commencing the performance of the work of this Agreement.
- (2) <u>Liability Insurance</u> The Contractor shall take out and maintain during the life of this Agreement such Bodily Injury Liability and Property Damage Liability Insurance as shall protect him/her while performing work covered by this Agreement from any and all claims for damages for bodily injury, including accidental death, as well as any and all claims for property damage which may arise from contractors operations under this Agreement, whether such operations be by himself/herself or by any sub-contractor or by anyone directly or indirectly employed by either of them. Such insurance shall be combined single limit bodily injury and property damage for each occurrence and shall be not less than the amount specified below.

Such insurance shall include:

(a)	Comprehensive General Liability	\$1,000,000
(b)	Motor Vehicle Liability Insurance	\$1,000,000
(c)	Professional Liability	\$1,000,000

County and its officers, agents, employees and servants shall be named as additional insured on any such policies of insurance, which shall also contain a provision that the insurance afforded thereby to the County, its officers, agents, employees and servants shall be primary insurance to the full limits of liability of the policy, and that if the County or its officers and employees have other insurance against the loss covered by such a policy, such other insurance shall be excess insurance only.

In the event of the breach of any provision of this section, or in the event any notice is received which indicates any required insurance coverage will be diminished or canceled, the County of San Mateo at its option, may, notwithstanding any other provision of this Agreement to the contrary, immediately declare a material breach of this Agreement and suspend all further work pursuant to this Agreement.

10. Compliance with laws; payment of Permits/Licenses

All services to be performed by Contractor pursuant to this Agreement shall be performed in accordance with all applicable Federal, State, County, and municipal laws, including, but not limited to, Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act of 1996 (HIPAA) and all Federal regulations promulgated thereunder, as amended, and the Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990, as amended, and Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973, as amended and attached hereto and incorporated by reference herein as Attachment "I," which prohibits discrimination on the basis of handicap in programs and activities receiving any Federal or County financial assistance. Such services shall also be performed in accordance with all applicable ordinances and regulations, including, but not limited to, appropriate licensure, certification regulations, provisions pertaining to confidentiality of records, and applicable quality assurance regulations.

In the event of a conflict between the terms of this agreement and State, Federal, County, or municipal law or regulations, the requirements of the applicable law will take precedence over the requirements set forth in this Agreement.

Contractor will timely and accurately complete, sign, and submit all necessary documentation of compliance.

11. Non-Discrimination and Other Requirements

A. Section 504 applies only to Contractor who are providing services to members of the public. Contractor shall comply with § 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973, which provides that no otherwise qualified handicapped individual shall, solely by reason of a disability, be excluded from the participation in, be denied the benefits of, or be subjected to discrimination in the performance of this Agreement.

- B. General non-discrimination. No person shall, on the grounds of race, color, religion, ancestry, gender, age (over 40), national origin, medical condition (cancer), physical or mental disability, sexual orientation, pregnancy, childbirth or related medical condition, marital status, or political affiliation be denied any benefits or subject to discrimination under this Agreement.
- C. Equal employment opportunity. Contractor shall ensure equal employment opportunity based on objective standards of recruitment, classification, selection, promotion, compensation, performance evaluation, and management relations for all employees under this Agreement. Contractor's equal employment policies shall be made available to County of San Mateo upon request.
- D. Violation of Non-discrimination provisions. Violation of the non-discrimination provisions of this Agreement shall be considered a breach of this Agreement and subject the Contractor to penalties, to be determined by the County Manager, including but not limited to
 - i) termination of this Agreement;
 - ii) disqualification of the Contractor from bidding on or being awarded a County contract for a period of up to 3 years;
 - iii) liquidated damages of \$2,500 per violation;
 - iv) imposition of other appropriate contractual and civil remedies and sanctions, as determined by the County Manager.

To effectuate the provisions of this section, the County Manager shall have the authority to examine Contractor's employment records with respect to compliance with this paragraph and/or to set off all or any portion of the amount described in this paragraph against amounts due to Contractor under the Contract or any other Contract between Contractor and County.

Contractor shall report to the County Manager the filing by any person in any court of any complaint of discrimination or the filing by any person of any and all charges with the Equal Employment Opportunity Commission, the Fair Employment and Housing Commission or any other entity charged with the investigation of allegations within 30 days of such filing, provided that within such 30 days such entity has not notified Contractor that such charges are dismissed or otherwise unfounded. Such notification shall include the name of the complainant, a copy of such complaint, and a description of the circumstance. Contractor shall provide County with a copy of their response to the Complaint when filed.

- E. Compliance with Equal Benefits Ordinance. With respect to the provision of employee benefits, Contractor shall comply with the County Ordinance which prohibits contractors from discriminating in the provision of employee benefits between an employee with a domestic partner and an employee with a spouse.
- F. The Contractor shall comply fully with the non-discrimination requirements required by 41 CFR 60-741.5(a), which is incorporated herein as if fully set forth.

12. Compliance with Contractor Employee Jury Service Ordinance

Contractor shall comply with the County Ordinance with respect to provision of jury duty pay to employees and have and adhere to a written policy that provides that its employees shall receive from the contractor, on an annual basis, no less than five days of regular pay for actual jury service in San Mateo County. The policy may provide that employees deposit any fees received for such jury service with the contractor or that the contractor deduct from the employees regular pay the fees received for jury service.

13. Retention of Records, Right to Monitor and Audit

- (a) CONTRACTOR shall maintain all required records for three (3) years after the COUNTY makes final payment and all other pending matters are closed, and shall be subject to the examination and/or audit of the County, a Federal grantor agency, and the State of California.
- (b) Reporting and Record Keeping: CONTRACTOR shall comply with all program and fiscal reporting requirements set forth by appropriate Federal, State and local agencies, and as required by the COUNTY.
- (c) CONTRACTOR agrees to provide to COUNTY, to any Federal or State department having monitoring or review authority, to COUNTY's authorized representatives, and/or their appropriate audit agencies upon reasonable notice, access to and the right to examine all records and documents necessary to determine compliance with relevant Federal, State, and local statutes, rules and regulations, and this Agreement, and to evaluate the quality, appropriateness and timeliness of services performed.

14. Merger Clause

This Agreement, including the Exhibits attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference, constitutes the sole Agreement of the parties hereto and correctly states the rights, duties, and obligations of each party as of this document's date. In the event that any term, condition, provision, requirement or specification set forth in this body of the agreement conflicts with or is inconsistent with any term, condition, provision, requirement or specification in any exhibit and/or attachment to this agreement, the provisions of this body of the agreement shall prevail. Any prior agreement, promises, negotiations, or representations between the parties not expressly stated in this document are not binding. All subsequent modifications shall be in writing and signed by the parties.

15. Controlling Law

The validity of this Agreement and of its terms or provisions, as well as the rights and duties of the parties hereunder, the interpretation, and performance of this Agreement shall be governed by the laws of the State of California.

16. Notices

Any notice, request, demand, or other communication required or permitted

hereunder shall be deemed to be properly given when deposited in the United States mail, postage prepaid, or when deposited with a public telegraph company for transmittal, charges prepaid, addressed to:

17. Notification

EXHIBIT A - SERVICES LIGAYA BRUCE-BADILLA DOING BUSINESS AS BRUCE-BADILLA BOARD AND CARE FY 2011 – 2014

In consideration of the payments set forth in Exhibit B, Contractor shall provide the following services:

I. DESCRIPTION OF SERVICES TO BE PERFORMED BY CONTRACTOR

In addition to the services required by license, Contractor shall provide under the general supervision of the department, services described below in a manner consistent with the terms and provisions of this Agreement.

A. Contractor shall operate a licensed residential care home in compliance with the State of California Community Care Licensing standards for County clients referred by County Behavioral Health and Recovery Services (BHRS) for supplemental services. County shall assess and pre-approve clients for supplemental payment. No approvals will be made prior to evaluation of the client by Resource Management.

B. DUAL DIAGNOSIS SERVICES

- Cooperate with County BHRS staff in developing client service plans. These plans shall be developed with the client, the facility administrator, and by the client's case manager.
- Maintain staffing and resources necessary to provide close and consistent care and supervision for dual diagnosis clients who have difficult behavioral problems. Provide for these clients with individualized creative behavioral interventions that enable the client to continue to live successfully in the community.
- 3. Participate in meetings and activities that facilitate a client's transition to and from higher levels of care.
- Assist in teaching clients to use public transportation, understand their medications, and to develop skills such as money management, shopping, and laundry. Assist clients in maintaining adequate personal hygiene.
- Provide or arrange transportation to facilitate client's participation in planned programs in the community. Assist clients by tracking and reminding them of their scheduled medical and mental health appointments; if necessary, provide transportation.

- 6. Work cooperatively with client and clinical staff to provide learning experience and skill training that could lead to future successful living in more independent settings.
- 7. Encourage and assist clients to attend mental health sponsored community-based programs such as supported education, supported employment, self-help activities and social events.
- 8. Formulate, plan, and post a calendar of house-sponsored community activities throughout the year.
- 9. Assist clients in maintaining the goals and objectives outlined in their individual County rehabilitation plans.
- Maintain regular, ongoing progress notes pertinent to each client's living skills and their movement towards the goals outlined in their individual service plans. Highlight problem areas in progress notes and notify involved County clinical staff of problem areas.
- 11. Contractor shall provide food/meals that are in accordance with and identified in Title 22, Division 6, Chapters 6 and 8, Community Care Licensing Policies and Procedures.
- 12. Provide to specific clients, special diets, foods, juices or snacks requested by physicians or regional clinical staff.
- 13. Provide consistent transportation to clinic and medical appointments.
- 14. Contractor shall provide a clean and sober living environment.
- 15. Provide intense support for clients with in-home program focused on dual diagnosis issues that includes the following:
 - a. Random urine screenings;
 - i. Daily house/community meetings;
 - ii. In-home dual diagnosis groups/meetings;
 - iii. Participation in County Dual Diagnosis groups:
 - iv. Participation in 12-step meetings at least three (3) times per week, both in the community and in-house; and
 - v. Ongoing collaborative treatment planning and treatment management with County Mental Health staff.
- 16. Facility Administrator shall annually attend dual diagnosis training(s) for a minimum of eight (8) CEU hours.

II. ADMINISTRATIVE REQUIREMENTS

- A. Arrange for, and provide documentation of, ten (10) hours of continuing education or training per employee, per year, above and beyond what is required by Community Care Licensing. Trainings provided by Resource Management throughout the year may be used for this purpose, as well as outside trainings.
- B. Maintain individual client records in accordance with County and state requirements. Allow County and staff access to the facility, to the extent authorized by law, for client assessment, monitoring, record review, and consultation.
- C. Participate in County's Management Information System. Supply needed documentation and information to the BHRS Program Office in a timely manner.
- D. Participate in required monthly supplemental services meetings and trainings as set up by Resource Management. Additional continuing education or other training may not be substituted for the monthly meetings.
- E. Notify and submit a copy of any licensing report noting a deficiency issued by licensing agency to Resource Management within forty-eight (48) hours from date received. Failure to comply with this provision will result in suspension from the program.
- F. Retain and show proof of a bond issued by a surety company in accordance with Community Care Licensing's regulations for a licensee who may be entrusted with care and/or control of client's cash resources.
- G. Paragraph 13 of the Agreement and Paragraph D of Exhibit B notwithstanding, Contractor shall maintain medical records required by the California Code of Regulations. Notwithstanding the foregoing, Contractor shall maintain beneficiary medical and/or clinical records for a period of seven (7) years, except that the records of persons under age eighteen (18) at the time of treatment shall be maintained: a) until one (1) year beyond the person's eighteenth (18th) birthday or b) for a period of seven (7) years beyond the date of discharge, whichever is later.
- H. Contractor shall facilitate the administration of all satisfaction survey instruments as directed by the County BHRS, including outcomes and satisfaction measurement instruments.
- I. Contractor shall submit a copy of any licensing report issued by a licensing agency to County BHRS Division Adult Services Deputy Director within ten (10) business days of Contractor's receipt of any such licensing report.

III. GOAL AND OBJECTIVE

GOAL 1: Clients shall be satisfied with services provided.

OBJECTIVE 1: At least ninety percent (90%) of clients shall rate services as

good or better.

EXHIBIT B – PAYMENTS AND RATES LIGAYA BRUCE-BADILLA DOING BUSINESS AS BRUCE-BADILLA BOARD AND CARE FY 2011 – 2014

In consideration of the services provided by Contractor in Exhibit A, County shall pay Contractor based on the following fee schedule:

I. Payments

In full consideration of the services provided by Contractor and subject to the provisions of Paragraph 3. ("Payments") of this Agreement, County shall pay Contractor in the manner described below, except that any and all payments shall be subject to the conditions contained in this Agreement.

- A. County shall pay Contractor for up to a maximum of ten (10) guaranteed beds per month. In addition, payment for two (2) additional beds shall be made on a fee-for-services basis.
 - Payment for Dual Diagnosis services shall be made for ten (10) beds a month at a rate of SIX HUNDRED DOLLARS AND SIXTY-FIVE CENTS (\$600.65) per bed, per month.
 - 2. Payment for two (2) additional beds shall be made on an as needed basis at the daily rate of NINETEEN DOLLARS AND SEVENTY-FIVE CENTS (\$19.75) per bed, per day.
- B. In any event, the maximum amount County shall be obligated to pay for services rendered under this Agreement shall not exceed TWO HUNDRED FIFTY-NINE THOUSAND FIVE HUNDRED THIRTY-FIVE DOLLARS (\$259,535).
- C. Payment for temporary absences shall be made according to the following state policies as outlined in Department of Mental Health Letter 86-01:
 - 1. Payment for temporary absence in the supplemental services program and for life support services in residential care facilities can be limited to seven (7) days per month. Such payment is allowable only under all of the following conditions:
 - a. the absence is consistent with the client's service and treatment plans;
 - b. the absence is necessary for the client's progress or maintenance at this level of care;
 - c. the absence is planned, or anticipated; and

- d. the absence, as well as the purpose(s) of the absence, are documented.
- 2. Payment for temporary absence for purposes of acute hospital or acute non-hospital (psychiatric health facility) treatment, or for treatment in other facilities which meet Title 9 staffing standards (Section 663), except as provided in section II, paragraph C(a) above, can be limited to ten (10) days per month. Payment is allowable if such treatment is necessary for the client to return to this level of care, i.e., in a residential care facility, and if the purpose(s) is documented.
- D. Contractor shall maintain individual client records in accordance with County and state requirements. Contractor shall allow County and staff access to the facility, to the extent authorized by law, for client assessment, monitoring, record review, and consultation.
- E. Budget modifications may be approved by the Chief of the Health System or designee, subject to the maximum amount set forth in Paragraph B.
- F. County anticipates the receipt of revenues from various sources to be used to fund services provided by Contractor through this Agreement. Should planned or actual revenues be less than the amounts anticipated at the time of the signing of this Agreement, the maximum payment obligation and/or payment obligations for specific services may be reduced at the discretion of the Chief of the Health System or designee.

G. Monthly Reporting

- 1. Payment by County to Contractor shall be monthly. Contractor shall bill County on or before the tenth (10th) working day of each month for the prior month. Contractor shall submit an original invoice only (faxes are not accepted), and shall include a summary of services and charges for the month of service. In addition contractor shall provide back-up to the invoice, which shall include individual client days and the level of service provided as well as a monthly admit and discharge sheet.
- 2. County reserves the right to modify the description of services as the County deems necessary.

- H. If County or Contractor finds that performance is inadequate, at the County's discretion, a meeting may be called to discuss the causes for the performance problem, and this Agreement may either be renegotiated, allowed to continue to end of term, or terminated pursuant to Paragraph 4 of this Agreement. Any unspent monies due to performance failure may reduce the following year's agreement, if any.
- In the event this Agreement is terminated prior to June 30, 2014, the Contractor shall be paid for services already provided pursuant to this Agreement.
- J. Contractor may bill and retain any Supplemental Security Income (SSI) or State Supplemental Payment (SSP) income payable by clients for room and board costs.
- K. The Contractor shall not hold beneficiaries liable for debts in the event that the County becomes insolvent, for costs of covered services provided under this or other contracts, referral or other arrangement rather than from the County.
- L. In the event Contractor claims or receives payment from County for a service, reimbursement for which is later disallowed by County or the State of California or the United States Government, then Contractor shall promptly refund the disallowed amount to County upon request, or, at its option, County may offset the amount disallowed from any payment due or become due to Contractor under this Agreement or any other agreement.
- M. Invoice Certification and Program Integrity

Anytime Contractor submits an invoice to the County for reimbursement for services provided under Exhibit A of this Agreement, Contractor shall certify by signature that the invoice is true and accurate by stating the invoice is submitted under the penalty of perjury under the laws of the State of California.

The invoice must include the following language and signature line at the bottom of the form(s) and/or cover letter used to report the invoice:

"Under the penalty of perjury under the laws of the State of California, I hereby certify that this invoice for services complies with all terms and conditions referenced in the Agreement with San Mateo County.
