**SUBJECT:** Agreement with the San Mateo County Office of Education

## **RECOMMENDATION:**

Adopt a Resolution:

- A. Waiving the Request for Proposal (RFP) process;
- B. Authorizing the President of the Board to execute an Agreement with the San Mateo County Office of Education for prevocational and remedial education programs within the County's correctional facilities, in an amount not-to-exceed \$124,306, funded through the Inmate Welfare Trust Fund, for a one (1) year term commencing July 1, 2011 to June 30, 2012; and
- C. Authorizing the Sheriff or Sheriff's designee to execute amendments and minor modifications to this agreement not to exceed an aggregate of \$25,000, on the condition that sufficient funds are available in the Inmate Welfare Fund; and/or to modify the contract term and/or services, so long as the modified term or services is/are within the current or revised fiscal provisions.

## BACKGROUND:

The Inmate Welfare Trust Fund has been set up under California Penal Code §4025, which provides that the sheriff may operate a commissary in the jail, and that profits shall be deposited into an Inmate Welfare Trust Fund. Section 4025 also provides that refund, rebate, or commission received from a telephone company for inmates' use of telephones shall be deposited into the Inmate Welfare Fund. The fund may only be used primarily for the benefit, education, and welfare of the inmates, and maintenance of county jail facilities, which includes the cost of operating programs to benefit the inmates, including, but not limited to, education, drug and alcohol treatment, welfare, library, accounting, and other programs deemed appropriate by the sheriff.

A committee consisting of the Assistant Sheriff, Corrections Division Captain and a community representative oversees the Inmate Welfare Trust Fund operation. Each year the committee receives proposals from service providers outlining their funding requests. The committee makes recommendations for award of contracts, most of which (because of the dollar amount) come before this Board of Supervisors for approval.

## **DISCUSSION:**

The San Mateo County Office of Education provides educational programs in the Sheriff's adult correctional facilities including classes in English, math, social studies, literature/arts, science, and reading. The sentenced inmate population has steadily utilized instructional classes that concentrate on General Education Development (GED) high school equivalency certificate preparation.

The Inmate Welfare Trust Fund Committee is recommending that the County contract with the Office of Education for basic skills instruction, GED certificate testing, vocational counseling, information and referral services, and follow-up services to inmates in the Sheriff's correctional facilities. Provision of these services is encouraged under Title XV and by the State Corrections Standards Authority during their bi-annual jail inspection.

The County has contracted with the Office of Education for these services since 1994. The Office of Education is the lead public education agency in San Mateo County and in that capacity coordinates all special educational programs such as in-custody GED course work. Therefore, it is in the best interest of the County to waive the RFP process and continue to contract with the Office of Education on the basis of being a sole source provider in the County of San Mateo.

The contractor has assured compliance with the County's Contractor Employee Jury Service Ordinance, as well as all other contract provisions that are required by County ordinance and administrative memoranda, including but not limited to insurance, hold harmless, non-discrimination and equal benefits.

Risk Management has reviewed the Contractor's insurance certificate to ensure requirements are met. County Counsel has reviewed and approved the Resolution and Agreement as to form.

Approval of this Agreement contributes to the Shared Vision 2025 outcome of a Healthy Community by enabling inmates to increase skills which will lead to a broader range of job opportunities, as well as help those inmates who are parents to instill a love of learning in their children.

## FISCAL IMPACT:

The Agreement is for a one-year term commencing on July 1, 2011 through June 30, 2012 and for an amount not to exceed \$124,306. The Agreement is fully funded through the Inmate Welfare Trust Fund and has been included in the FY 2011-12 Sheriff's Office Recommended Budget. There is no Net County Cost.

AUTHORIZING THE SHERIFF OR SHERIFF'S DESIGNEE TO EXECUTE AMENDMENTS AND MINOR MODIFICATIONS TO THIS AGREEMENT NOT TO EXCEED AN AGGREGATE OF \$25,000, ON THE CONDITION THAT SUFFICIENT FUNDS ARE AVAILABLE IN THE INMATE WELFARE FUND; AND/OR TO MODIFY THE CONTRACT TERM AND/OR SERVICES, SO LONG AS THE MODIFIED TERM OR SERVICES IS/ARE WITHIN THE CURRENT OR REVISED FISCAL PROVISIONS.

WHEREAS, there has been presented to this Board of Supervisors for its consideration and acceptance an Agreement, reference to which is hereby made for further particulars, whereby the San Mateo County Office of Education shall provide prevocational and educational services to inmates within the County's correctional facilities, with said services to be paid with Inmate Welfare Trust Funds; and

WHEREAS, the San Mateo County Office of Education has been providing

services to inmates in the County's correctional facilities for more than a decade; and

WHEREAS, it is in the best interest of the County to waive the Request for

Proposals process because the San Mateo County Office of Education is the sole cost-

effective source of the type of inmate services that it provides; and

WHEREAS, both parties now wish to enter into an Agreement, to provide prevocational and remedial educational services for inmates within the County's correctional facilities, for an amount not to exceed \$124,306, and for a one (1) year term commencing July 1, 2011 through June 30, 2012; and

WHEREAS, this Board has been presented with a form of such Agreement and has examined and approved same as to both form and content, and desires to enter into same:

## NOW THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY DETERMINED AND ORDERED that the:

- 1. Request for Proposals process is waived;
- 2. President of this Board of Supervisors be, and is hereby authorized to, execute the Agreement with the San Mateo County Office of Education, for and on behalf of the County of San Mateo, and the Clerk of this Board of Supervisors shall attest the President's signature thereto; and
- 3. Sheriff or Sheriff's designee is hereby authorized to execute amendments and minor modifications to this Agreement not to exceed an aggregate of \$25,000, on the condition that sufficient funds are available in the Inmate Welfare Fund, and/or modify the contract term and/or services so long as the modified term or services is/are within the current or revised fiscal provisions.

# AGREEMENT

# BETWEEN THE COUNTY OF SAN MATEO AND SAN MATEO COUNTY OFFICE OF EDUCATION

THIS AGREEMENT, entered into this \_\_\_\_\_ day of \_\_\_\_\_\_, 2011, by and between the COUNTY OF SAN MATEO, hereinafter called "County," and SAN MATEO COUNTY OFFICE OF EDUCATION, hereinafter called "Contractor";

## WITNESSETH:

*WHEREAS*, pursuant to Government Code, Section 31000, County may contract with independent contractors for the furnishing of such services to or for County or any Department thereof;

WHEREAS, it is necessary and desirable that Contractor be retained for the purpose of performing the professional services hereinafter described as prevocational and remedial education programs within the County's detention facilities described in this agreement; and.

## NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY AGREED BY THE PARTIES HERETO AS FOLLOWS:

## 1. EXHIBITS AND ATTACHMENTS

The following exhibits and attachments are included hereto and incorporated by reference herein:

- Exhibit A Services
- Exhibit B Payments and rates
- Attachment I §504 Compliance

## 2. SERVICES TO BE PERFORMED BY CONTRACTOR

In consideration of the payments set forth herein and in Exhibit "B," Contractor shall perform services for County in accordance with the terms, conditions and specifications set forth herein and in Exhibit "A."

## 3. <u>PAYMENTS</u>

In consideration of the services provided by Contractor in accordance with all terms, conditions and specifications set forth herein and in Exhibit "A," County shall make payment to Contractor based on the rates and in the manner specified in Exhibit "B." The County reserves the right to withhold payment if the County determines that the quantity or quality of the work performed is unacceptable. In no event shall the County's total fiscal obligation under this Agreement exceed **ONE HUNDRED TWENTY-FOUR THOUSAND THREE HUNDRED SIX DOLLARS AND NO CENTS (\$124,306.00)**.

## 4. TERM AND TERMINATION

Subject to compliance with all terms and conditions, the term of this Agreement shall be from JULY 1, 2011 through JUNE 30, 2012.

This Agreement may be terminated by Contractor, the Sheriff or his/her designee at any time without a requirement of good cause upon thirty (30) days' written notice to the other party.

In the event of termination, all finished or unfinished documents, data, studies, maps, photographs, reports, and materials (hereafter referred to as materials) prepared by Contractor under this Agreement shall become the property of the County and shall be promptly delivered to the County. Upon termination, the Contractor may make and retain a copy of such materials. Subject to availability of funding, Contractor shall be entitled to receive payment for work/services provided prior to termination of the Agreement. Such payment shall be that portion of the full payment which is determined by comparing the work/services completed to the work/services required by the Agreement.

## 5. AVAILABILITY OF FUNDS

The County may terminate this Agreement or a portion of the services referenced in the Attachments and Exhibits based upon unavailability of Federal, State, or County funds, by providing written notice to Contractor as soon as is reasonably possible after the County learns of said unavailability of outside funding.

## 6. <u>RELATIONSHIP OF PARTIES</u>

Contractor agrees and understands that the work/services performed under this Agreement are performed as an independent Contractor and not as an employee of the County and that Contractor acquires none of the rights, privileges, powers, or advantages of County employees.

## 7. HOLD HARMLESS

- A. It is agreed that Contractor shall defend, save harmless and indemnify County, its officers and employees from any and all claims which arise out of the terms and conditions of this Agreement and which result from the negligent acts or omissions of Contractor, its officers and/or employees.
- B. It is agreed that County shall defend, save harmless, and indemnify Contractor, its officers and employees from any and all claims for injuries or damage to persons and/or property which arise out of the terms and conditions of this Agreement and which result from the negligent acts or omissions of County, its officers and/or employees.
- C. In the event of concurrent negligence of County, its officers and/or employees, and Contractor, its officers and/or employees, then the liability for any and all claims for injuries or damage to persons and/or property which arise out of terms and conditions of this Agreement shall be apportioned according to the California theory of comparative negligence.

#### ASSIGNABILITY AND SUBCONTRACTING 8.

Contractor shall not assign this Agreement or any portion thereof to a third party or subcontract with a third party to provide services required by contractor under this Agreement without the prior written consent of County. Any such assignment or subcontract without the County's prior written consent shall give County the right to automatically and immediately terminate this Agreement.

#### 9. **INSURANCE**

The Contractor shall not commence work or be required to commence work under this Agreement unless and until all insurance required under this paragraph has been obtained and such insurance has been approved by Risk Management, and Contractor shall use diligence to obtain such insurance and to obtain such approval. The Contractor shall furnish the County with certificates of insurance evidencing the required coverage, and there shall be a specific contractual liability endorsement extending the Contractor's coverage to include the contractual liability assumed by the Contractor pursuant to this Agreement. These certificates shall specify or be endorsed to provide that thirty (30) days' notice must be given, in writing, to the County of any pending change in the limits of liability or of any cancellation or modification of the policy.

- A. Worker's Compensation and Employer's Liability Insurance The Contractor shall have in effect during the entire life of this Agreement Workers' Compensation and Employer's Liability Insurance providing full statutory coverage. In signing this Agreement, the Contractor certifies, as required by Section 1861 of the California Labor Code, that it is aware of the provisions of Section 3700 of the California Labor Code which requires every employer to be insured against liability for Worker's Compensation or to undertake self-insurance in accordance with the provisions of the Code, and I will comply with such provisions before commencing the performance of the work of this Agreement.
- B. Liability Insurance The Contractor shall take out and maintain during the life of this Agreement such Bodily Injury Liability and Property Damage Liability Insurance as shall protect him/her while performing work covered by this Agreement from any and all claims for damages for bodily injury, including accidental death, as well as any and all claims for property damage which may arise from contractors operations under this Agreement, whether such operations be by himself/herself or by any sub-contractor or by anyone directly or indirectly employed by either of them. Such insurance shall be combined single limit bodily injury and property damage for each occurrence and shall be not less than the amount specified below.

Such insurance shall include:

- 1) Comprehensive General Liability \$1,000,000
- 2) Motor Vehicle Liability Insurance \$1,000,000 \$1,000,000
- 3) Professional Liability

County and its officers, agents, employees and servants shall be named as additional insured on any such policies of insurance, which shall also contain a provision that the insurance afforded thereby to the County, its officers, agents, employees and servants shall be primary insurance to the full limits of liability of the policy, and that if the County or its officers and employees have other

insurance against the loss covered by such a policy, such other insurance shall be excess insurance only.

In the event of the breach of any provision of this section, or in the event any notice is received which indicates any required insurance coverage will be diminished or canceled, the County of San Mateo at its option, may, notwithstanding any other provision of this Agreement to the contrary, immediately declare a material breach of this Agreement and suspend all further work pursuant to this Agreement.

## 10. COMPLIANCE WITH LAWS; PAYMENT OF PERMITS/LICENSES

All services to be performed by Contractor pursuant to this Agreement shall be performed in accordance with all applicable Federal, State, County, and municipal laws, including, but not limited to, Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act of 1996 (HIPAA) and all Federal regulations promulgated thereunder, as amended, and the Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990, as amended, and Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973, as amended and attached hereto and incorporated by reference herein as Attachment "I," which prohibits discrimination on the basis of handicap in programs and activities receiving any Federal or County financial assistance. Such services shall also be performed in accordance with all applicable ordinances and regulations, including, but not limited to, appropriate licensure, certification regulations, provisions pertaining to confidentiality of records, and applicable quality assurance regulations. Further, Contractor certifies that the Contractor and all of its subcontractors will adhere to all applicable provisions of Chapter 4.106 of the San Mateo County Ordinance Code, which regulates the use of disposable food service ware.

In the event of a conflict between the terms of this agreement and State, Federal, County, or municipal law or regulations, the requirements of the applicable law will take precedence over the requirements set forth in this Agreement.

Contractor will timely and accurately complete, sign, and submit all necessary documentation of compliance.

## 11. NON-DISCRIMINATION AND OTHER REQUIREMENTS

- A. Section 504 applies only to Contractor who are providing services to members of the public. Contractor shall comply with § 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973, which provides that no otherwise qualified handicapped individual shall, solely by reason of a disability, be excluded from the participation in, be denied the benefits of, or be subjected to discrimination in the performance of this Agreement.
- B. General non-discrimination. No person shall, on the grounds of race, color, religion, ancestry, gender, age (over 40), national origin, medical condition (cancer), physical or mental disability, sexual orientation, pregnancy, childbirth or related medical condition, marital status, or political affiliation be denied any benefits or subject to discrimination under this Agreement.
- C. Equal employment opportunity. Contractor shall ensure equal employment opportunity based on objective standards of recruitment, classification, selection, promotion, compensation, performance evaluation, and management relations for all employees under this Agreement. Contractor's equal employment policies shall be made available to County of San Mateo upon request.

- D. *Violation of Non-discrimination provisions.* Violation of the non-discrimination provisions of this Agreement shall be considered a breach of this Agreement and subject the Contractor to penalties, to be determined by the County Manager, including but not limited to:
  - i) termination of this Agreement;
  - ii) disqualification of the Contractor from bidding on or being awarded a County contract for a period of up to 3 years;
  - iii) liquidated damages of \$2,500 per violation;
  - iv) imposition of other appropriate contractual and civil remedies and sanctions, as determined by the County Manager.

To effectuate the provisions of this section, the County Manager shall have the authority to examine Contractor's employment records with respect to compliance with this paragraph and/or to set off all or any portion of the amount described in this paragraph against amounts due to Contractor under the Contract or any other Contract between Contractor and County.

Contractor shall report to the County Manager the filing by any person in any court of any complaint of discrimination or the filing by any person of any and all charges with the Equal Employment Opportunity Commission, the Fair Employment and Housing Commission or any other entity charged with the investigation of allegations within 30 days of such filing, provided that within such 30 days such entity has not notified Contractor that such charges are dismissed or otherwise unfounded. Such notification shall include the name of the complainant, a copy of such complaint, and a description of the circumstance. Contractor shall provide County with a copy of their response to the Complaint when filed.

- E. *Compliance with Equal Benefits Ordinance.* With respect to the provision of employee benefits, Contractor shall comply with the County Ordinance which prohibits contractors from discriminating in the provision of employee benefits between an employee with a domestic partner and an employee with a spouse.
- F. The Contractor shall comply fully with the non-discrimination requirements required by 41 CFR 60-741.5(a), which is incorporated herein as if fully set forth.

## 12. COMPLIANCE WITH CONTRACTOR EMPLOYEE JURY SERVICE ORDINANCE

Contractor shall comply with the County Ordinance with respect to provision of jury duty pay to employees and have and adhere to a written policy that provides that its employees shall receive from the Contractor, on an annual basis, no less than five days of regular pay for actual jury service in San Mateo County. The policy may provide that employees deposit any fees received for such jury service with the Contractor or that the Contractor deduct from the employees' regular pay the fees received for jury service.

## 13. RETENTION OF RECORDS, RIGHT TO MONITOR AND AUDIT

A. Contractor shall maintain all required records for three (3) years after the County makes final payment and all other pending matters are closed, and shall be subject to the examination and/or audit of the County, a Federal grantor agency, and the State of California.

- B. Reporting and Record Keeping: Contractor shall comply with all program and fiscal reporting requirements set forth by appropriate Federal, State and local agencies, and as required by the County.
- C. Contractor agrees to provide to County, to any Federal or State department having monitoring or review authority, to County's authorized representatives, and/or their appropriate audit agencies upon reasonable notice, access to and the right to examine all records and documents necessary to determine compliance with relevant Federal, State, and local statutes, rules and regulations, and this Agreement, and to evaluate the quality, appropriateness and timeliness of services performed.

## 14. MERGER CLAUSE

This Agreement, including the Exhibits attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference, constitutes the sole Agreement of the parties hereto and correctly states the rights, duties, and obligations of each party as of this document's date. In the event that any term, condition, provision, requirement or specification set forth in this body of the agreement conflicts with or is inconsistent with any term, condition, provision, requirement or specification in any exhibit and/or attachment to this agreement, the provisions of this body of the agreement shall prevail. Any prior agreement, promises, negotiations, or representations between the parties not expressly stated in this document are not binding. All subsequent modifications shall be in writing and signed by the parties.

## 15. CONTROLLING LAW AND VENUE

The validity of this Agreement and of its terms or provisions, as well as the rights and duties of the parties hereunder, the interpretation, and performance of this Agreement shall be governed by the laws of the State of California. Any dispute arising out of this Agreement shall be venued either in the San Mateo County Superior Court or the United States District Court for the Northern District of California.

## 16. NOTICES

Any notice, request, demand, or other communication required or permitted hereunder shall be deemed to be properly given when both (1) transmitted via facsimile to the telephone number listed below and (2) either deposited in the United Sates mail, postage prepaid, or when deposited for overnight delivery with an established overnight courier that provides a tracking number showing confirmation of receipt for transmittal, charges prepaid, addressed to:

## **EXHIBIT A - SERVICES**

AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE COUNTY OF SAN MATEO AND SAN MATEO COUNTY OFFICE OF EDUCATION

In consideration of the payments set forth in Exhibit B, Contractor shall provide the following services:

## 1. DESRIPTION OF SERVICES TO BE PROVIDED BY CONTRACTOR.

Contractor agrees to provide educational services to inmates at the Maguire Correctional Facility [MCF], Women's Correctional Center [WCC], and Women's Transitional Facility [WTF]. Services provided to inmates include:

- A. Intake and assessment for a minimum of 150 inmates selected by Contractor. Each participant will be screened through pre-testing programs for their basic skills and level performance.
- B. Instruction in basic skills improvement and GED preparation [i.e. English, math, social studies, literature/arts, science, vocabulary and reading] to a minimum of 100 inmates.
- C. Conduct GED testing within the facilities on a monthly basis.
  - 1. Administer a minimum of 200 GED tests (annually).
  - 2. A minimum of 40 inmates (annually) will take the test for the first time.

## **EXHIBIT B - PAYMENT & RATES**

AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE COUNTY OF SAN MATEO AND SAN MATEO COUNTY OFFICE OF EDUCATION

In consideration of the services set forth in Exhibit A, County shall pay Contractor according to the following:

## 1. RATE SCHEDULE

- A. Services and Supplies.....\$17,132 Salaries and Benefits Total.....\$107,174 TOTAL CONTRACT AMOUNT.....\$124,306
- B. All monies used to pay Contractor for services provided in this Agreement shall be taken from the Inmate Welfare Fund, and the County's responsibility to make the payments is contingent on and limited to the availability of adequate funds in the Inmate Welfare Fund.
- C. Contractor shall assume full responsibility for payment to sub-contractors. Contractor shall assume full responsibility for filing of any payroll or earnings reports to both state and federal agencies.

## 2. PAYMENT RATE

- A. Contractor shall submit a quarterly invoice to County. County will pay Contractor a flat quarterly rate of \$26,793.50 (1/4 of the "Salaries and Benefits Total"). In addition, County will reimburse Contractor actual retail cost for supplies purchased in connection with services provided under this Agreement. Cost of services and supplies will not exceed \$17,132 for the term of this Agreement.
  - 1. Contractor will include with invoice a quarterly report detailing the services provided to inmates and the number of inmates contacted and/or assisted.
- B. County will verify the amount of the invoices and pay Contractor accordingly. County shall have the right to withhold payment if County determines that the quantity or quality of the work performed is unacceptable.
- C. Contractor shall submit final bill within 90 days from expiration of this Agreement to the MCF Administrative Lieutenant or his/her designee.

## ATTACHMENT I Assurance of Compliance with Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973, as Amended
